ABOUT THE COACH

The 1968 School year was quite a haul for Head Coach Roland Schmidt. In addition to winning the MAC Baseball crown last spring, the young mentor notched his third consecutive 8-0 football campaign and now is the winningest football mentor in the country with 29 straight. The Colonel baseballers also had a seven game streak to open the 1969 season.

Coach Schmidt is a 1950 graduate of Coughlin High School and a 1956 Alumnus of Bloomsburg State College. The mentor was active in football and track for the both institutions.

Prior to moving to Wilkes in 1962 as head Baseball and Football Coach, "Rollie" served as an assistant at Abington Heights and Kingston School Districts.

1969 BASEBALL OUTLOOK

The Colonels of Coach Roland Schmidt are the defending MAC Northern Division Champs. After a 4-4 midseason log last spring the Wilkesmen surprised many by winning their last seven straight contests to capture their first MAC Crown.

The mound corps should be bolstered with the addition of Ted Sokolowski. The young freshman southpaw gives Coach Schmidt four pitchers from which to find a starter for each game. Joe Zakowski, Charlie Fick, and John Baranowski are back intact. The trio only offered opponents 2.02 runs per contest last spring.

Backstop position is deep with Joe Skvarla handling the chores. Bob Vignoli and Dave Kaschak, both newcomers, add sufficient depth. Infield is set with only thirdbase not occupied. Ted Yeager, Mike Bergbauer, and Kaschak all vying very closely for Captain John Lodomirak's vacant spot. Tom Higgins and Pat Salantri, 372 and 417 hitters respectively last spring, are one of the best double play combinations in MAC. George Stults will be secure at first.

Veterans Joe Wiendl and Carl Cook occupy two of the three outfield slots but the other slot remains up for grabs between Yeager, John Stanley, Don Reese, and Don Lewis.

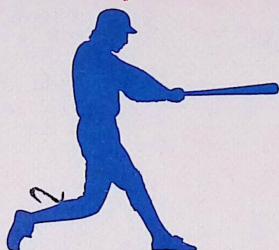

THE COACH—GENE DOMZALSKI (ninth year 113-38)

Gene Domzalski shows eight years at the helm of the Wilkes College baseball Colonels.

During his tenure at the college, the Glen Lyon (Pa.) native has posted an enviable record, registering 113 wins against only 38 losses. His 1976 squad captured the NCAA Regional Mideast Tournament and went on to place fourth in the NCAA Division III World Series at Marietta, Ohio. Last season, the Blue and Gold captured its second Middle Atlantic Conference championship, disposing of Scranton 8-4, and Gettysburg 8-6, in the MAC playoffs. Wilkes advanced to the Mideast Regionals for the second straight year, but the Colonels were upended in the first game of the double elimination tourney by Marietta, the eventual tourney champion.

An outstanding athlete in his own right, Gene won a total of nine football, basketball, and baseball letters at Newport High School. He was a Wyoming Valley League cage choice in his senior year.

Later matriculating at the University of Wyoming, Domzalski played football and baseball for the Cowboys. His college grid coach was Bob Devaney, who later gained fame at the University of Nebraska. Gene was picked by Woody Hayes as one of the top twenty halfbacks in the country and had the opportunity to play in the Sun Bowl and led the nation in kickoff return yardage as a freshman.

His athletic career at Wyoming was cut short when he signed a professional baseball contract in 1958. Gene played in the New York Yankee organization for six years before retiring in 1964. He was a member of two minor-league all-star teams and advanced as high as Triple A.

Domzalski finished his degree requirements at Wyoming and returned to the Wilkes-Barre area in 1965 and assumed the head basketball coaching position at Newport High School. When the Greater Nanticoke Area School District came into being in 1966, Gene was appointed as its first baseball coach and paced the Trojans to three Southern Division and one PIAA District II titles.

He was added to the Wilkes staff on a part-time basis in 1968 aiding in the football program. Gene joined the Wilkes faculty on a fulltime basis one year later. Domzalski holds a master's degree from East Stroudsburg and Wilkes College.

Married to the former Arlene Barnowski, the Domzalski's are the parents of three children—Ed, Sharon, and Jim.

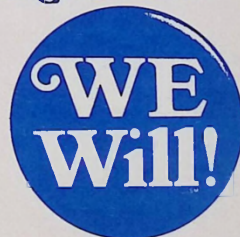
