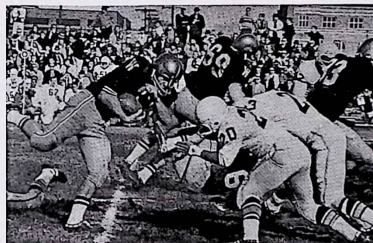

HEAD COACH ROLAND C. SCHMIDT

Coach Schmidt is in his sixth year at Wilkes and during that period has brought two Middle Atlantic Conference championships to the school. His 1966 team also won the initial Lambert Bowl awarded for supremacy in college division football in the East. A 1950 graduate of Coughlin High School in Wilkes-Barre, "Rollie" took part in football, wrestling and track. He attended Bloomsburg State College before serving two years in the Army and returned to the school in 1955 where he took part in football and track.

The head coach graduated from Bloomsburg in 1956 with a B.S. in education and served as a member of the Clarks Summit teaching staff for three years. In addition he was assistant football, head wrestling and assistant track coach at Clarks Summit. He taught at Kingston High School and was assistant football coach for three years. Coach Schmidt holds a master's degree from University of Scranton. He is married to the former Margaret Dombroski.

ASSISTANT COACH JONAH GOOBIC

A 1954 graduate of Plains High School, Coach Goobic played football, baseball and basketball in high school. He graduated from Bloomsburg State College in 1958 and took part in football and baseball at the college. He teaches at Northwest High School, Shickshinny, and is first assistant and backfield coach at Wilkes. He is also assistant baseball coach. Coach Goobic is in his sixth year at Wilkes.

ASSISTANT COACH JOHN EWASTATION

John graduated from Coughlin High School, where he played football and then had three years of Marine Corps football at Camp Lejeune. He was the mainstay of the King's College line during his time at the Wilkes-Barre college and was captain of the football team in his senior year. A 1960 graduate of King's, he is head wrestling coach at Meyers High School, Wilkes-Barre, and was an assistant football coach at that school. Ewastation is married and has one daughter. He is defensive line coach for the Colonels.

ASSISTANT COACH CHARLES ADONIZIO

A 1964 graduate of Wilkes, "Chuck" played football at the University of Pittsburgh before transferring to Wilkes where he received his degree in business administration. He played football at St. John's High School in Pittston City and attended Fork Union Military Academy. A top football player at Wilkes, Adonizio is offensive line coach for the Colonels. He is married to the former Catherine Fahey and is associated in business with Addy Asphalt Company, Wilkes-Barre.

ASSISTANT COACH JOHN LUKIS

A graduate of Burlington High School, N.J., John played football and baseball in high school. He graduated from Springfield College, Mass., in 1964, where he played quarterback on the football team. Lukis will be an assistant coach in charge of quarterbacks. He is married to the former Betty Severi of Burlington, N.J.

ASSISTANT COACH THOMAS TROSKO

Tom was outstanding in football, baseball and basketball at Wilkes, receiving the Gallagher Award for football and the Outstanding Athlete Award for 1965. Trosko was captain of the football and basketball teams at Wilkes. A graduate of Plains Memorial High School, Trosko played football, baseball and basketball in high school. He is an assistant coach working with the defensive secondary and head scout for the Colonels.

DR. ANTHONY TURCHETTI

The team physician for six years, Dr. Turchetti graduated from Wyoming High School, Penn State and Hahnemann Medical College. He also attended George Washington Law School. After interning at Wilkes-Barre General Hospital, Dr. Turchetti practiced medicine for several years before taking residency in psychiatry. He is current chief resident in psychiatry at Philadelphia General Hospital.

MICHAEL BABUSCHAK — Junior offensive end from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School . . . can play both ways . . . used at offense last year . . . strong blocker.

ROGER BEATTY — Senior halfback from Exeter . . . gained 202 yards on the ground last year . . . highly underrated . . . gets the tough yardage when needed.

BRUCE COMSTOCK — Junior offensive tackle from W. Pittston . . . All-M.A.C. tackle as a freshman and sophomore . . . opens up the big holes . . . football and track standout in high school.

MIKE CONNOLLY — Junior defensive linebacker from West Side Catholic High School in Kingston . . . solid two-way performer . . . as a freshman grabbed 10 passes, three of them good for TD's . . . converted to the defensive last year . . . good tackler . . . tough competitor.

GEORGE CONWAY — Sophomore center from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin . . . stepped in as a starter last year after Captain Ralph Hendershot was injured . . . very agile . . . strong.

BARRY DAVENPORT — Sophomore offensive end from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin . . . strong contender for a starting berth . . . has all the moves . . . won 8 letters in high school.

DOUG FORDE — Junior halfback from W. Islip, N.Y. . . . gained 138 yards rushing against P.M.C. last year . . . excels on kick-off returns, holding career record for most yards gained.

JOE FRAPPOLLI — Junior quarterback from Florence, N.J. . . . has backed up vets for the past two seasons . . . can move the team . . . good scrambler . . . will be fighting for a starter spot.

GARY HEGEL — Sophomore linebacker from E. Islip, N.Y. . . . was Al Yatko's backup man last year . . . tough competitor . . . potential future standout.

JAY HOLLIDAY — Junior defensive halfback from Rockville, Md. . . . vital link to the Colonels' secondary defensive unit . . . two interceptions last year . . . small, but loaded with desire.

JOHN JARVELLA — Senior offensive back from Fitchburg, Mass. . . . utility man the last three seasons . . . also can play linebacker . . . is one of the best blocking backs on the team.

P. J. KANE — Junior defensive linebacker from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School . . . had field day against Delaware Valley last season, pilfering three passes . . . sturdy player who can also play offensive center . . . all-Scholastic in high school.

JOE KOTERBA — Junior defensive end from Wilkes-Barre G.A.R. High School . . . tough on end sweeps . . . good hustle . . . all-M.A.C. end last year . . . captained baseball and basketball teams in high school.

BILL LAYDEN — Junior defensive tackle from Wilkes-Barre G.A.R. High School . . . was the team's number two man in tackles made last year . . . strong, aggressive pass rusher . . . very agile for a 230-pounder . . . all-M.A.C. tackle the past two seasons . . . mainstay of Colonel line.

ANGELO LOVERRO — Junior offensive guard from E. Islip, N.Y. . . . can fill in at the linebacker spot if needed . . . hardnose blocker . . . led the way on the Colonels' offense attack last year . . . good desire.

DANIEL MALLOY — Junior defensive halfback from Trucks-ville, Pa. . . . outstanding pass defender . . . ran back an intercepted pass against Juniata for 45 yards . . . former three-sport standout at West Side Catholic High School.

PAUL MERRILL — Junior defensive end from Nanticoke . . . solid two-year performer for the Colonels . . . hard-hitting tackler . . . good pursuit . . . had key interception against P.M.C. last year.

LEE NAMEY — Senior halfback from Wilkes-Barre Meyers . . . had banner day against Moravian last year, gaining 100 yards on the ground . . . could be the key to the Colonels ground attack this season . . . former high school All-American.

JOE ROSZKO — Senior offensive guard from Dupont . . . co-captain of this year's team . . . selected as the top Colonel offensive lineman last season . . . powerful blocker.

JOE SKVARLA — Junior offensive end from Plymouth . . . one of the best ends to ever don a blue and gold uniform . . . holds Colonel record for passes caught in season . . . caught a game-winning 60-yarder against Delaware Valley . . . good hands . . . catcher on baseball team.

BILL STAAKE — Sophomore from Silver Springs, Md. . . used as a specialty man last season . . . averaged 33.4 per punt . . . his 66-yarder against Delaware Valley is the tops in Colonel history . . . also a grappler on the Wilkes wrestling team.

JOE WIENDL — Junior defensive halfback from Westfield, N.J. . . . most valuable athlete award at Wilkes last year . . . durable punt returner, legging back 36 punts for 361 yards . . . 67-yard TD return against Drexel . . . has 8 interceptions over the last two seasons . . . all-M.A.C. defensive halfback . . . finished as runnerup in the N.C.A.A. wrestling tournament last winter . . . 160-pound M.A.C. wrestling champ . . . also plays third base on the baseball team.

JIM WOLFE — Junior offensive end from Forty Fort . . . excellent speed . . . 6'4" . . . good hands . . . former football, basketball and track standout at Forty Fort High School.

BRINLEY VARCHOL — Senior defensive linebacker from Hanover Twp. . . . holds Colonel career record for interceptions with nine . . . ran two interceptions last year to paydirt . . . jarring tackler . . . co-captain of this year's squad . . . standout student.

JOE ZAKOWSKI — Sophomore quarterback from Hanover Twp. . . . although used sparingly last season, led the team in offense with 385 yards . . . top-flight pitcher on Colonels' baseball team . . . dazzled fans last year with his 80-yard last-second touchdown pass against Lebanon Valley . . . outstanding potential.

JUNIOR TRANSFEREES who will be battling it out for starting positions will be Rich Simonson, a former Meyers quarterback sensation; Ed Burke, an all-scholastic tackle with Coughlin in 1964; and Vince Yarmel, a former standout

lineman at Central Catholic High School, Kingston. Other returning lettermen who will be trying to crack the starting lineup are: ends, Tom Ambrosi, John Howe, who was plagued with an injury last season, and Les Loveland; interior linemen, John Chaump, Al Peterfreund and Ed Roman; and backs, Jerry Moser and Dave Peterfreund. Other non-lettering returnees: John Williamson, at end; Jerry Mullarkey and Joe Kolm, both backs.

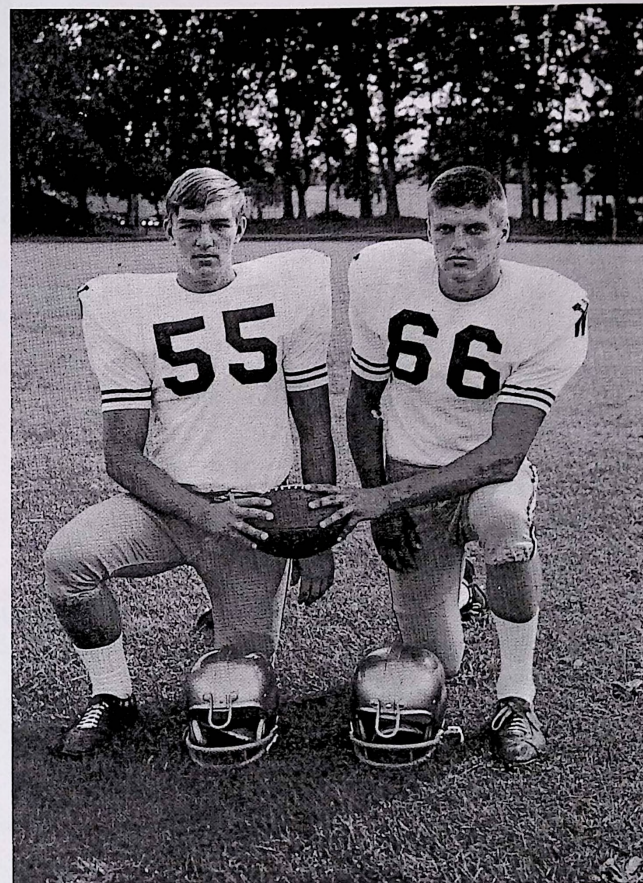

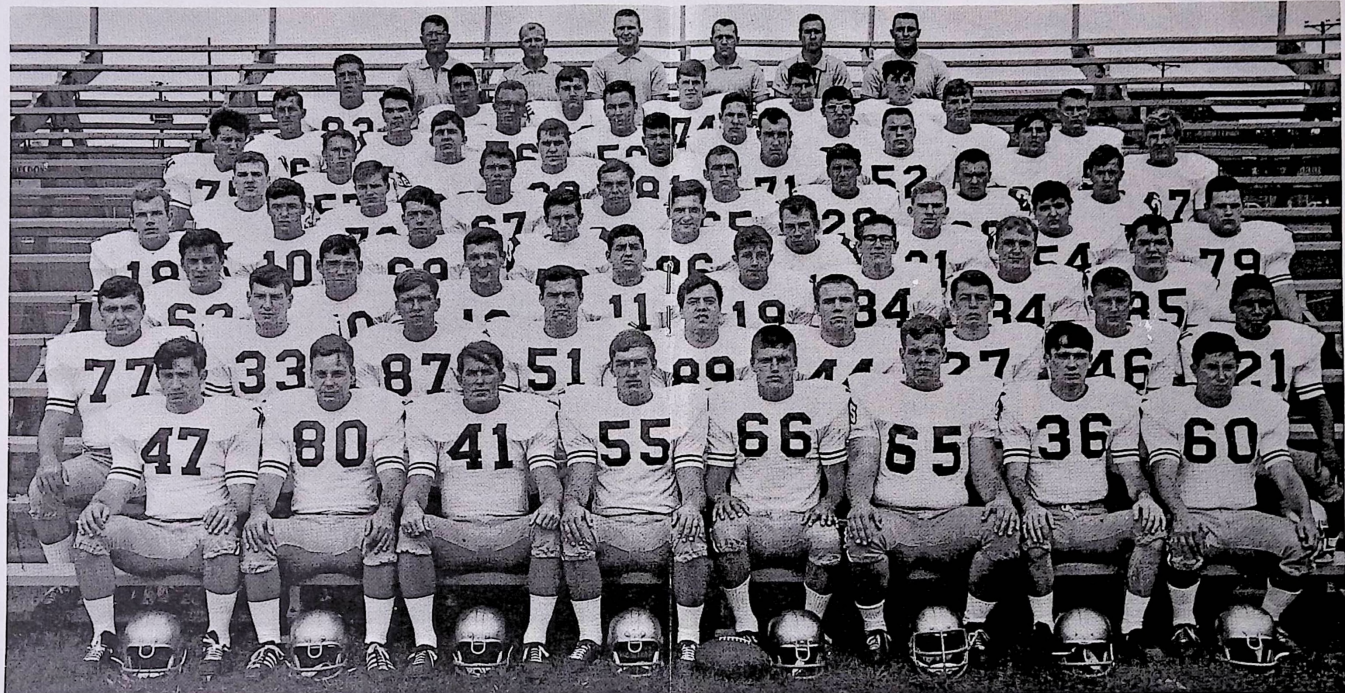

OUTLOOK FOR 1967

The Colonels gained national recognition last year with an 8-0 record which brought them the Lambert Bowl, awarded for the first time to the outstanding college division team in the East.

Graduation took five key men from that undefeated, untied squad, including the quarterback, fullback, top-rushing halfback, middle linebacker and offensive center, who was also team captain.

On the bright side, Coach Rollie Schmidt has 35 returning lettermen to bolster all of these positions, including sophomore Joe Zakowski, who was "sensational" at quarterback in the few games in which he saw action as a freshman. There are also three junior transfers and four non-lettering returnees attempting to make the team. The Colonels will run from the "I" formation.

Last year's defensive team, which didn't allow a single touchdown by the pass route, returns almost intact. The only loss from that outstanding unit, however, is a big one, Al Yatko, who was "Mister Everything" for the Colonels at middle-linebacker. Replacing "Big Al" will be a problem but Coach Schmidt hopes to move P. J. Kane, left linebacker, into the middle spot and keep Brinley Varchol, this year's co-captain, at right. The left spot is up for grabs among the returning lettermen and transfers.

This year's opponents are all from the Middle Atlantic Conference and all will be pointing to knock off the defending champions. A repeat of last year's record is within the realm of possibility if the Colonels in 1967 keep the 1966 attitude and "refuse to be beaten."
