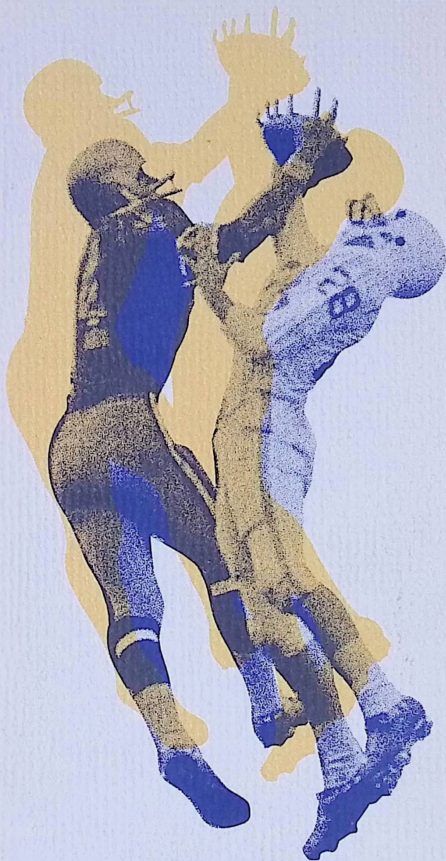


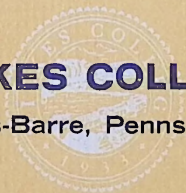

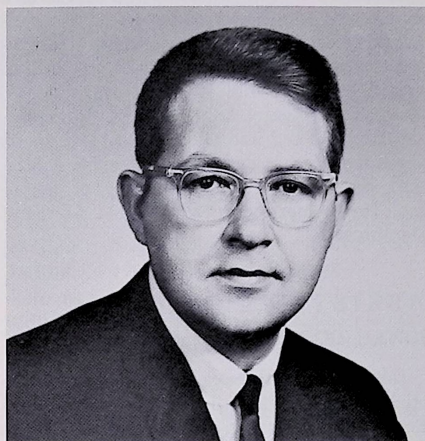

COACHES



HEAD COACH

ROLAND C. SCHMIDT ✓

The upcoming 1969 football season will find Coach Roland Schmidt beginning his eighth year as the Colonels' mentor. In seven years he has accumulated a lifetime log of 38-16. His teams in the last four years have won 31 of 32 contests and currently are riding the crest of a 29-game winning streak, the longest in collegiate football. Coupled with this incredible record are four M.A.C. championships, two Lambert trophies, and one Timmie Award, gained last year for being the outstanding collegiate team in the country.

Schmidt has also achieved success on the baseball field. In the past two seasons his teams have won 22-5, including an M.A.C. championship in 1968.

A 1950 graduate of Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School, Coach Schmidt took part in football, wrestling and track. He attended Bloomsburg State College before serving a two-year stint with the Army. Returning to Bloomsburg in 1955, "Rollie" played football and track for the Huskies.

The mentor graduated from Bloomsburg in 1956 with a B.S. in education and served as a member of the Clarks Summit teaching staff for three years. In addition to being an assistant football coach, he also served as the head wrestling coach and assistant track coach. The Wilkes mentor later moved on to Kingston High School and was an assistant coach for three years. Coach Schmidt holds a master's degree from the University of Scranton. He is married to the former Margaret Dombroski.

ASSISTANT COACHES

JONAH GOOBIC — Offensive Backs

Jonah was a three-sport athlete at Plains High School. Graduating from that Wilkes-Barre area institution in 1954, Coach Goobic was a standout football, baseball, and basketball player. He later matriculated at Bloomsburg State College, receiving a degree from that down-river institution in 1958. During his four years at Bloomsburg he played football and baseball. Jonah teaches at the Northwest Area High School, Shickshinny, and is first assistant and backfield coach at Wilkes. In the spring he serves also as an assistant baseball coach for the Colonels. Coach Goobic will be starting his eighth year at Wilkes.

CHARLES ADONIZIO — Offensive Line

A former Colonel line standout, Coach Adonizio played two years of football at the University of Pittsburgh before transferring to Wilkes where he played under Coach Schmidt. "Chuck" received his degree in Business Administration. He played high school football for St. John's High School in Pittston and later attended the Fork Union Military Academy. At Wilkes, Coach Adonizio has been offensive line coach for the past three years. He is married to the former Catherine Fahey and is associated in business with the Addy Asphalt Company, Wilkes-Barre.

GENE DOMZALSKI — Defensive Line

A recent full-time addition to the Wilkes teaching staff, Domzalski is beginning his second year as a Colonel coach. Gene played for five years in the New York Yankee chain before retiring in 1964. He matriculated at Newport Township High School and starred in baseball, basketball, and football for the Nutcrackers. In his sophomore year at the University of Wyoming, Domzalski led the nation in punt returns. Two years ago he guided the Nanticoke Area Trojans to their first PIAA District Two baseball championship.

Next spring he will make his debut as the Wilkes Colonel baseball mentor. Gene is married to the former Arline Barnowski of Wilkes-Barre.

ROBERT HERMAN — Defensive Linebackers

Bob will return to Wilkes College after a six-year lapse. A 1963 graduate of Wilkes College, Herman was a center for the Colonels during the lean years between 1960 and 1962. He was a three-year Wilkes letterman and capped his grid career by being named to the MAC team.

Herman received his Master's Degree from Scranton University in 1967 and will remain in the Wyoming Valley West School District as a teacher and wrestling coach. He is a native of Nanticoke. He is married to the former Carol Wojciekowski and they are the parents of a daughter.

ROBERT CORBA — Defensive Secondary

Corba is another new addition to the Colonels' coaching staff. He is a graduate of Abraham Clark High School in Roselle, New Jersey, where he played football and baseball. After high school he continued his education at Upper Iowa College, receiving his degree in 1966. He was formerly an assistant coach at Northwest Area High School. Corba is married to the former Alice Koury of Wilkes-Barre. The new mentor will remain on the physical education staff at Coughlin High School.

TEAM PHYSICIAN

DR. ANTHONY TURCHETTI

Dr. Turchetti has been the Wilkes team physician for the last eight years. He graduated from Wyoming High School, Penn State, and Hahnemann Medical College. He also attended George Washington Law School. After interning at Wilkes-Barre General Hospital, the Colonel physician practiced medicine there for several years before taking residency in psychiatry. A versatile man, Dr. Turchetti also holds degrees in engineering and law.

COLONELS EXPLODE IN CLASSROOM

The Wilkes Colonel gridsters extended their prowess to the classroom as well as the football field as they compiled a combined 2.51 cumulative average for the spring semester, well over the average of the student body. 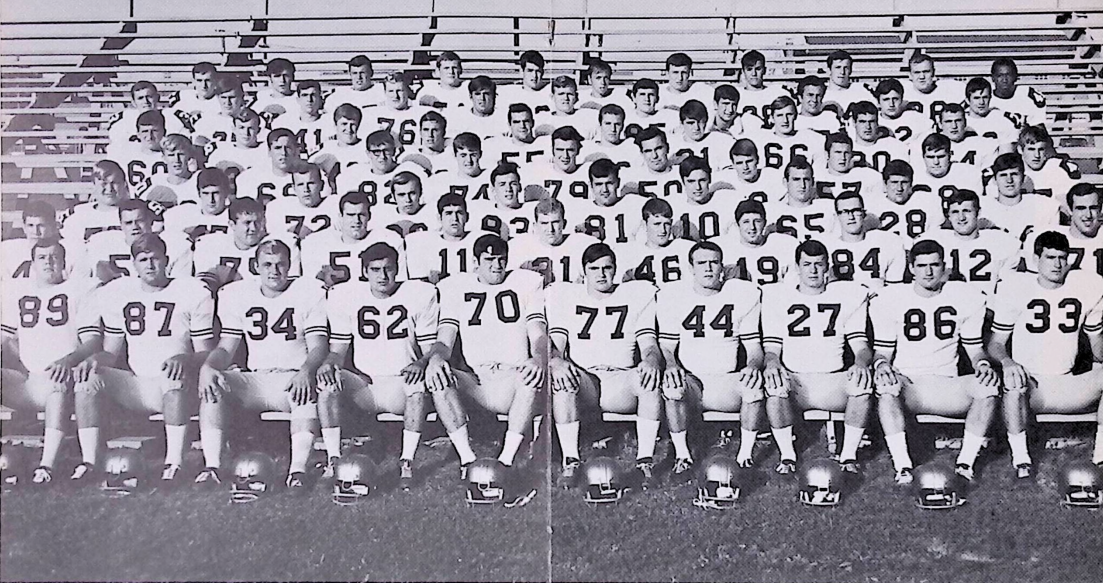

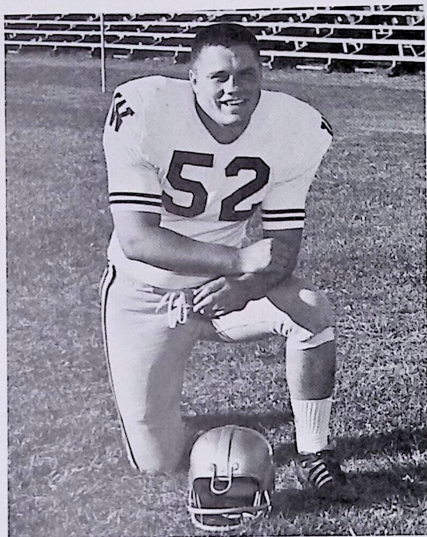

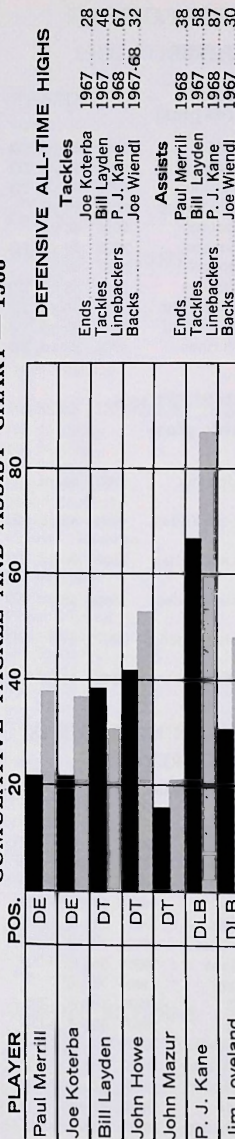
