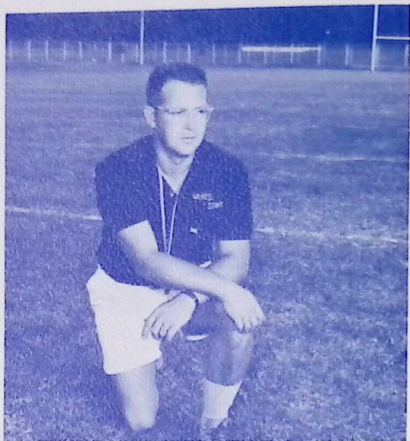

COACHES



HEAD COACH

ROLAND C. SCHMIDT

This year Coach Roland Schmidt will begin his seventh season at the helm of the Wilkes Colonels. During this time he has compiled a 30-16 lifetime record. His teams in the past three years have posted an incredible 23-1 log which includes three Middle Atlantic Conference championships.

A 1950 graduate of Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School, Coach Schmidt took part in football, wrestling and track. He attended Bloomsburg State College before serving a two year stint with the Army. Returning to Bloomsburg in 1955, "Rollie" played football and track for the Huskies.

The mentor graduated from Bloomsburg in 1956 with a B.S. in education and served as a member of the Clarks Summit teaching staff for three years. In addition to being an assistant football coach, he also served as the head wrestling coach and assistant track coach. The Wilkes mentor later moved on to Kingston High School and was an assistant coach for three years. Coach Schmidt holds a master's degree from the University of Scranton. He is married to the former Margaret Dombroski.

ASSISTANT COACH

CHARLES ADONIZIO

A former Colonel line standout, Coach Adonizio played two years of football at the University of Pittsburgh before transferring to Wilkes where he played under Coach Schmidt. "Chuck" received his degree in Business Administration. He played high school football for St. Johns High School in Pittston and later attended the Fork Union Military Academy. At Wilkes, Coach Adonizio has been offensive line coach for the past two years. He is married to the former Catherine Fahey and is associated in business with the Addy Asphalt Company, Wilkes-Barre.

ASSISTANT COACH

JOHN LUKIS

Coach Lukis was a top flight football and baseball player at Burlington High School in New Jersey. Later moving on to Springfield College, Massachusetts, he played quarterback on the grid team before graduating in 1964. Last year for the Colonels, "Jake" served as a backfield coach and also helped out on the diamond with Coach Schmidt in the Spring. He is married to the former Betty Severi of Burlington, New Jersey.

ASSISTANT COACH

GENE DOMZALSKI

A recent addition to the Wilkes Grid coaching staff, Domzalski played for five years in the New York Yankee farm System before retiring in 1964. Gene matriculated at Newport Township high school and starred in Baseball, Basketball, and Football for the Nutcrackers. Domzalski led the nation in punt return average playing for the University of Wyoming in 1958. Last spring he guided the Nanticoke Area Trojans to their first P.I.A.A. District Two Baseball championship. The new assistant mentor will remain teaching in the Nanticoke Area School system. Under Coach Schmidt he will serve as Defensive co-ordinator. Gene is married to the former Arline Barnowski of Wilkes-Barre.

ASSISTANT COACH

JONAH GOOBIC

Jonah was a three sport athlete at Plains High School. Graduating from that Wilkes Barre Area institution in 1954 Coach Goobic was a standout football, baseball, and basketball player. He later matriculated at Bloomsburg State College, receiving a degree from that down river institution in 1958. During his four years at Bloomsburg he played football and baseball. Jonah teaches at the Northwest Area High School, Shickshinny, and is first assistant and backfield coach at Wilkes. In the spring he serves also as an assistant baseball coach for the Colonels. Coach Goobic will be starting his seventh year at Wilkes.

ASSISTANT COACH

BRINLEY VARCHOL

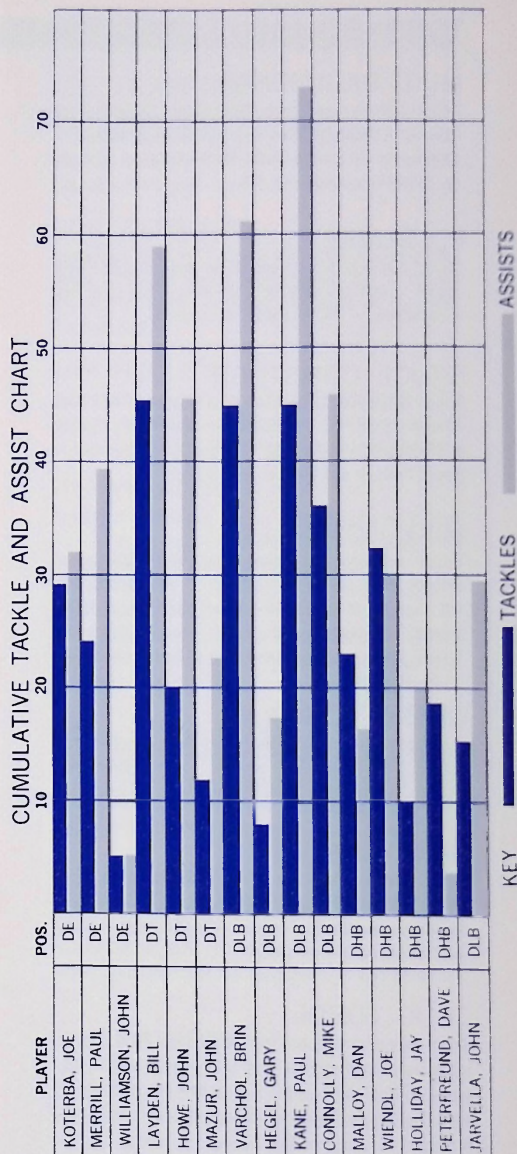
Another recent addition to the coaching staff, coach Varchol is a product of the Wilkes College dynasty, having served four years under the tutelage of coach Schmidt. A linebacker during his career at Wilkes, Brinley was co-captain of last years 8-0 MAC Championship team. He was chosen to the Pennsylvania All State College team last year and ended his college tenure with a total of ten interceptions. Coach Varchol played high school football and wrestling at Hanover Township. In addition to being an offensive line coach, Brinley will serve as an assistant grappling mentor under Coach John Reese. He will teach in the Wilkes Barre School System.

ANTHONY TURCHETTI

Dr. Turchetti has been the Wilkes Team physician for the last seven years. He graduated from Wyoming High School, Penn State, and Hahneman Medical College. He also attended George Washington Law School. After interning at Wilkes Barre General Hospital, the Colonel physician practiced medicine there for several years before taking residency in psychiatry. He is currently the chief resident of psychiatry at Philadelphia General Hospital. A versatile man, Dr. Turchetti also holds degrees in engineering and law.

MIKE BABUSCHAK

Senior offensive end from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School — solid blocker — enrolled in Summer PLC course with the United States Marine Corps — tight end — caught six passes last fall.

ED BURKE

Junior offensive tackle from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School — fast and agile for a big man — can place kick if necessary — All-Scholastic at Coughlin.

BRUCE COMSTOCK

Senior Defensive tackle from West Pittston — All MAC Offensive tackle for the last three years — Co-Captain of this years Colonel squad — opens up the big gaps — played football and track in high school.

MIKE CONNOLLY

Senior defensive linebacker from West Side Central Catholic High School in Kingston — recorded 81 hits last year — at corner linebacker he is tough to get around — wicked on end sweeps — caught 10 passes, 3 touchdowns as a freshman end — great hands.

GEORGE CONWAY

Junior offensive center from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School — pre-ministerial student — very strong and durable — has been starter since freshman year.

BARRY DAVENPORT

Junior offensive flanker back from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School — grabbed eight passes last year — has the moves necessary for a great college career — strong — 8 letterman in high school.

DOUG FORDE

Senior offensive halfback from West Islip, New York — holds season and all time record for kick-off return yardage — 687 lifetime yards — returned two kick-offs 94 and 79 yards last year for TD — picked up 87 yards rushing.

JOE FRAPPOLLI

Senior Offensive Quarterback from Florence, New Jersey — against Moravian last fall hit 6-7 passes for 68 yards and two touchdowns — clutch performer — shows he can move the squad — a real scrambler and competitor.

BOB GENNARO

Sophomore offensive halfback from Lake Hiawatha, New Jersey — up and coming future Colonel star — hits the line with authority — gained 107 yards on 25 carries last campaign.

JAY HOLLIDAY

Senior Defensive back from Rockville, Maryland — five lifetime interceptions — injured in first game last fall — can hit hard for a small man — three year letterman.

HARRY HOOVER

Sophomore defensive tackle from Binghamton, New York — works hard — could possibly be ready for a starting berth this fall — lot of action last year.

JOHN HOWE

Senior Defensive tackle from West Pittston — 64 total stoppers in his initial year of varsity ball — injured first two years — likes to hit — small for a tackle but quick.

PAUL "PJ" KANE

Senior Defensive Linebacker from Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School — led Colonels in tackles and assists last autumn with 110 — seven lifetime interceptions — savage tackler — can also play offensive center.

DAVE KASCHAK

Sophomore Offensive Halfback from West Side Central Catholic High School — banner day against Ursinus rushing for 56 yards in first half before being injured — kicked 10 points after the touchdown — very promising future.

JOE KOTERBA

Senior Defensive Tackle from Wilkes-Barre GAR High School — All MAC Defensive end in 1967 — good hustle and pursuit — involved in 61 tackles — captained baseball and basketball teams in high school.

BILL LAYDEN

Senior defensive tackle from Wilkes-Barre GAR High School — All MAC Tackle last three falls — Co-Captain of this years squad — Number two man in tackles and assists with 104 — strong, aggressive and mean pass rusher — mainstay of Wilkes line.

BILL LAZOR

Sophomore Offensive end from Scranton — built to go — excellent speed — very rangy — understudy to Joe Skvarla — should be a Colonel star of the future.

ANGELO LOVERRO

Senior offensive guard from East Islip, New York — has started 24 games for Wilkes — good desire — should really shine on the line in his final year — can play line-backer in need.

DAN MALLOY

Senior defensive halfback from West Side Central Catholic High School — greatest day came last year against Moravian when he pilfered 5 passes — seven life time interceptions — three-sport standout in high school.

JOHN MAZUR

Sophomore defensive tackle from Avoca — Armed forces veteran — 243 pounder with a 35 inch waistline — torrid on ball carriers — looked good in his first year of football last fall.

PAUL MERRILL

Senior defensive end from Nanticoke High School — All MAC at end as a junior — hardhitter — tough on the sweep — 60 hits — will fight all the way.

RICHARD SIMONSON

Senior offensive quarterback from Wilkes-Barre Meyers High School — hit for 248 yards passing and 178 yards rushing sharing duties last autumn — played freshman football at Davidson — four touchdowns — rifle arm — can run.

JOE SKVARLA

Senior offensive end from Plymouth High School — top end in Wilkes Football History — holds five Wilkes pass catching records — 20 receptions in 1967 — catcher on Blue and Gold baseball team — All-MAC End.

BILL STAAKE

Junior kicking specialist from Silver Springs Maryland — booted nine extra points versus Haverford — his 66 yard punt against Delaware Valley in 1966 still longest in Wilkes record books — wrestles in the winter.

JOE WIENDL

Senior defensive safety from Westfield, New Jersey — Second Team All-American is his Junior year — NCAA Small College Wrestling Champion last winter — 35-1 dual meet wrestling career record — hit .353 and led MAC in stolen bases with 12 last baseball season — holds five Wilkes College Football records 12 career interceptions — had 96 yard punt return against Ursinus and 90 yard interception versus PMC — ALL-MAC last fall at safety.

VINCE YARMEL

Senior offensive Fullback from West Side Central Catholic High School — power of backfield bulled 335 yards in his initial season at Wilkes after transferring from Toledo

JOE ZAKOWSKI

Junior offensive quarterback from Hanover Township High School — hit 25-49 for 331 yards in 1967 — scored three TD's — 6-1 last spring as a hurler on the baseball team — southpaw who can throw the long bomb.

OTHER PROSPECTS

After sitting out a year of ineligibility, former Meyers High Fullback Charlie Fick and West Side Central All-Scholastic Pat Malloy seem almost certain of starting roles. Nate Eustis, a Binghamton native, is also in strong contention for a tackle or linebacker position. Other letterman returnees who might be ready to move are: end — John Williamson, who has been getting a share of plaguing injuries which has kept him from starting; Guards — Les Loveland, Gary Hegel, Jim Loveland and Joe Kolm; centers — Alton Kenney, and Ed Roman; and Backs — Fred Harkins, Dave Peterfreund, and Jerry Moser. Other non-lettermen who may help are: backs Aldo Farnetti and Stan Zientek and guard Gary Moore.

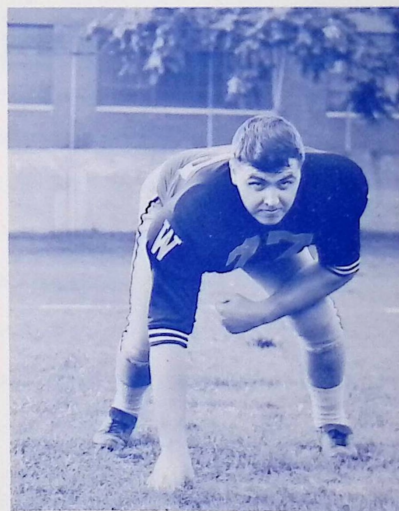

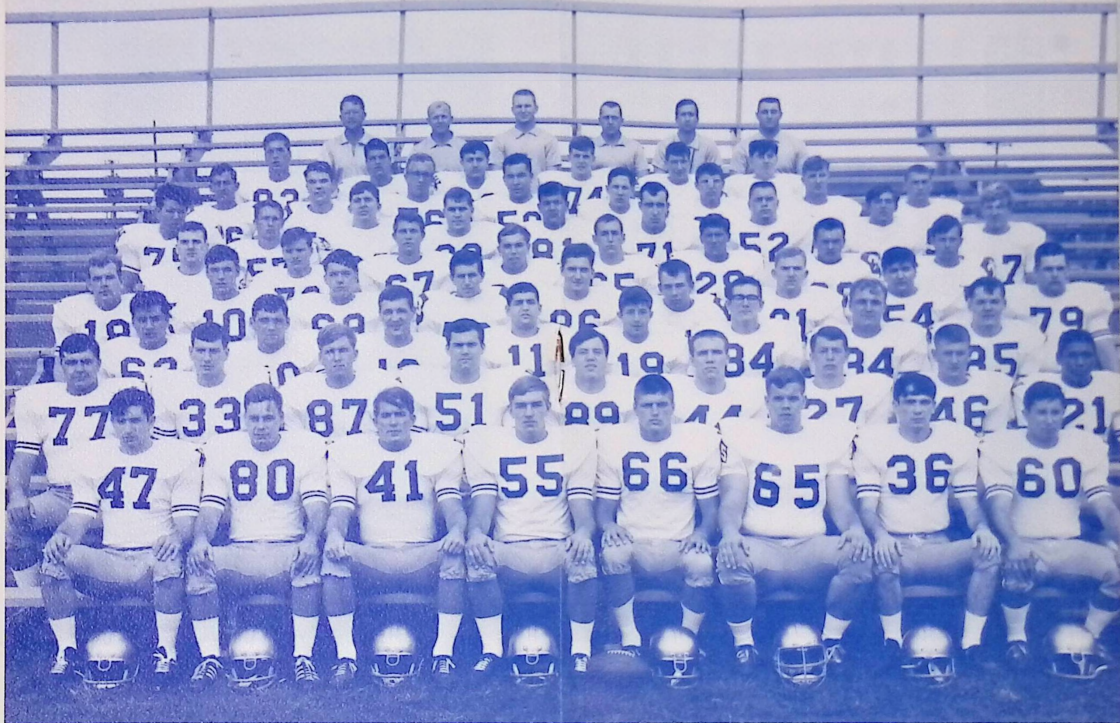

OUTLOOK FOR 1968

The Colonels continued to stay perched in the national limelite last year posting another unblemished 8-0 record. Having accumulated a 21 game winning streak, each game in the fall of 1968 promises to be rocky sailing with every opponent fighting desperately to knock the Wilkesmen off the top.

Graduation has taken a few key personnel away. Lost via June commencement was Roger Beatty, the teams leading ground gainer. Brinley Varchol and John Jarvella, half of the Colonels linebacking corps, and Joe Roszko, the teams best interior offensive lineman.

On the rosy side, Coach Roland Schmidt will be greeting 37 returning lettermen, giving him depth at nearly every position. This year's crop of incoming freshmen appears to be one of the best in the school's grid history. Two junior transferees and three returning non-lettermen will also add strength to the squad.

Last year's defensive alignment, which was ranked eighth in the nation in total defense will be back almost intact. The front line, the "Flagrant Four" will return complete. Bill Layden, Paul Merrill, and Joe Koterba were all First Team MAC Selections. John Howe completes the foursome.

Two linebacking positions will be up for grabs to the newcomers. This area might be the only problem area for Coach Schmidt. P. J. Kane and Mike Connolly, three year veterans, return at this spot. The defensive backfield of All American Joe Wiendl, Jay Holliday, and Dan Malloy give the Wilkesmen one of the strongest backfields in the MAC.

With the exception of Roszko, the entire interior offensive line — Ed Burke, Angelo Loverro, George Conway, and three time all MAC Tackle Bruce Comstock — will be back. The offensive attack will be bolstered by the Colonels troika quarterback threat of Joe Frappolli, Joe Zakowski, and Rick Simonson. Runners Bob Gennaro, Vince Yarmel, Douge Forde, and Dave Kaschak and pass receivers Barry Davenport, Mike Babuschak, and Joe Skvarla, give the Schmidtmens a two offense attack.
