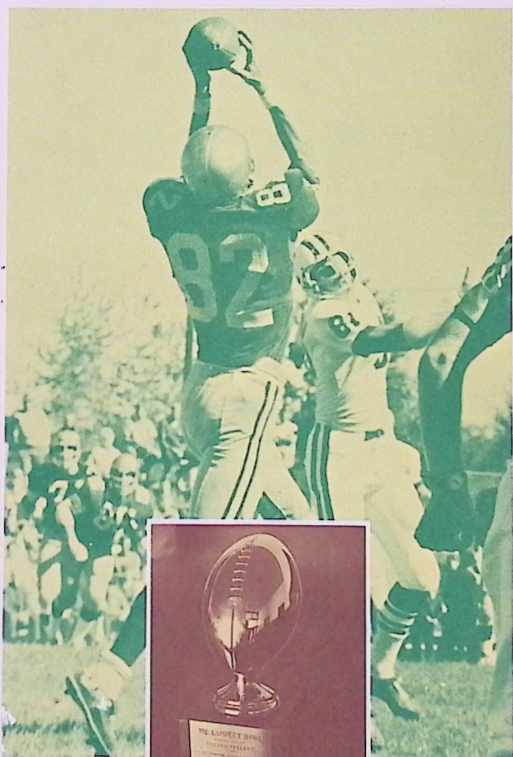

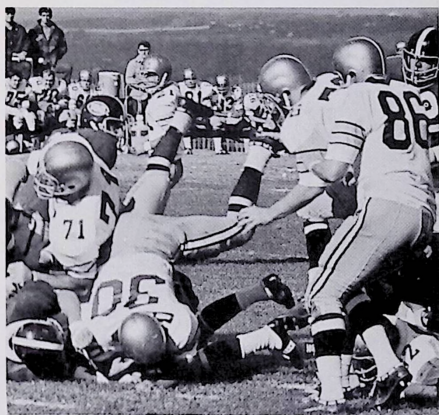

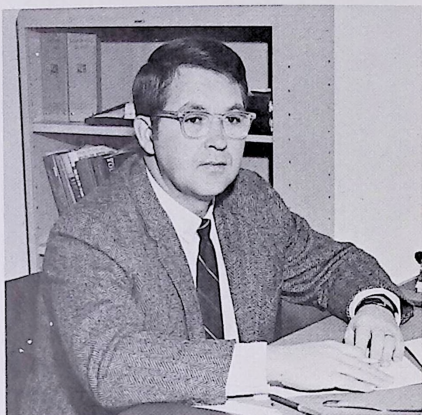

HEAD COACH



ROLAND C. SCHMIDT

Roland Schmidt will begin his ninth season at the helm of the Wilkes Colonels this fall. During this time he has compiled a 44-18 record (.710 percentage) which ranks him 20th among college division coaches in the nation today.

From 1965 to 1969 his squads terrorized the Middle Atlantic Conference and other eastern independents, winning 37 of 40 contests. Included in this impressive total are five straight Northern Division MAC titles (1965-69); two Lambert Bowls, symbolic of ECAC Division III supremacy (1966, 1968); three straight undefeated seasons (1966, 1967, 1968); and a 32-game winning streak, the third longest in the history of NCAA College Division.

Not to be outdone on other fields of sport, Schmidt coached the Wilkes baseball team from 1962-69, and this spring assumed the duties as the golf mentor. His 1968 and 1969 baseball teams combined for a 22-5 record, which included an MAC championship in 1968, by far one of the few coaches to ever gain dual championships of major sports in the same year. Although loaded with underclassmen, Coach Schmidt guided the Colonel duffers to an 8-3 record in his first year of golf coaching this spring.

A 1950 graduate of Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School, "Rollie" took part in football, wrestling, and track. He attended Bloomsburg State College for two years before serving a two-year stint in the Army. Returning to Bloomsburg upon the completion of his military obligation, the Colonel head participated in football and track for the Huskies.

His coaching career began at Clarks Summit High School where he served as assistant football, track, and head wrestling coach for three years. Schmidt put in another three-year tour with Kingston High School as an assistant before moving on to Wilkes in 1962.

ASSISTANT COACHES

JONAH GOOBIC—Offensive Backs

Jonah was a three-sport athlete at Plains High School. Graduating from that Wilkes-Barre area institution in 1954, Coach Goobic was a standout football, baseball, and basketball player. He later matriculated at Bloomsburg State College, receiving a degree from that down-river institution in 1958. During his four years at Bloomsburg he played football and baseball. Jonah teaches at the Northwest Area High School, Shickshinny, and is first assistant and backfield coach at Wilkes. In the spring he serves also as an assistant baseball coach for the Colonels. Coach Goobic will be starting his ninth year at Wilkes.

CHARLES ADONIZIO — Offensive Line

A former Colonel line standout, Coach Adonizio played two years of football at the University of Pittsburgh before transferring to Wilkes where he played under Coach Schmidt. "Chuck" received his degree in Business Administration. He played high school football for St. John's High School in Pittston and later attended the Fork Union Military Academy. At Wilkes, Coach Adonizio has been offensive line coach for the past four years. He is married to the former Catherine Fahey and is associated in business with the Addy Asphalt Company, Wilkes-Barre.

GENE DOMZALSKI — Defensive Line

Gene is currently beginning his third year as a Colonel coach. He played for five years in the New York Yankee chain before retiring in 1965. Domzalski is a localite, graduating from Newport Township High School where he paced the Nutcrackers in baseball, basketball, and football.

A graduate of the University of Wyoming, the Blue and Gold assistant led the nation in punt returns during his sophomore year. After guiding the Nanticoke Area Trojans to two straight baseball crowns and a PIAA District Two championship, Gene was appointed to the Wilkes College physical education staff last summer. He coached the Colonel baseballers to an 11-6 showing in his maiden year this spring. Domzalski is married to the former Arline Barnowski of Wilkes-Barre.

ROBERT HERMAN — Defensive Linebackers

Bob will return to Wilkes College for his second year. A 1963 graduate of Wilkes College, Herman was a center for the Colonels during the lean years between 1960 and 1962. He was a three-year Wilkes letterman and capped his grid career by being named to the MAC team.

Herman received his Master's Degree from Scranton University in 1967 and will remain in the Wyoming Valley West School District as a teacher and wrestling coach. He is a native of Nanticoke. He is married to the former Carol Wojcieckowski and they are the parents of a daughter.

ROBERT CORBA — Defensive Secondary

Corba is another second-year returnee to the Colonels' coaching staff. He is a graduate of Abraham Clark High School in Roselle, New Jersey, where he played football and baseball. After high school he continued his education at Upper Iowa College, receiving his degree in 1966. He was formerly an assistant coach at Northwest Area High School. Corba is married to the former Alice Koury of Wilkes-Barre. The new mentor will remain on the physical education staff at Coughlin High School.

RICHARD ORLOWSKI — Defense

Dick is the newest addition to the Wilkes coaching staff. A native of Kingston, the now Colonel aid participated in basketball, track, and football for the Huskies, topping it off with Wyoming Valley All-Scholastic honors in 1958.

Moving on to Bucknell, he played three years of football for the Bisons before graduating in 1963. He gained his Master's degree in Economics from the University of Delaware and currently is a doctoral candidate at Rutgers University. Married to the former Virginia H. Zalewski, the Wilkes faculty member will work with the defense.
