COACH RON RAINEY

This year Coach Rainey will be starting his fourth year at the helm of the Colonels. Since inheriting the head coaching reins of Wilkes in 1965, after the team posted a 3-17 record, the young mentor has done a remarkable job in rekindling a winning spirit in the Wilkesmen. Last Winter the Colonels compiled a 12-11 log, their first winning season in 10 years.

Coach Rainey, a native of Johnstown, Pa., played three years of varsity basketball and baseball at Penn State University. At Penn State he completed his undergraduate requirements and received his masters of Education in 1961. Rainey's first coaching assignment was at Chester High School where he built a mediocre team into a state title contender. His 1965 team reached all the way to the state semi-finals before bowing to the eventual state champion. His three total at Chester was 52-17, with the 1964-65 team streaking to a 23-1 log.

Moving to Wilkes in the fall of 1965, Coach Rainey has succeeded in re-building a once decayed and lifeless basketball program. In addition to his duties as a Physical Education Instructor and Basketball Coach, the mentor also serves as the assistant tennis coach. Rainey is married to the former Rosabelle Kitzmiller of Harrisburg.

OUTLOOK FOR 1968-69

After compiling their first winning season in ten years, the Colonel hoopsters don't seem likely to give up this winning spirit for the coming year. Coach Ron Rainey will be greeting back his entire starting five from last season. The only performer lost through last spring's graduation was team captain Jim Smith, who was injured for most of the season.

Again the Wilkesmen lack extensive height and will have to rely on a running attack to wither down much taller opponents. On separate occasions last winter the Colonels beat far more experienced teams with speed and hustle. Look for those same qualities in this year's cage Colonels.

The MAC should be evenly balanced for the coming year and a tough race is expected between five or six squads. Added strength in the form of incoming prospects Ted Frey, Charles Wetzell, and Dave Kurosky should give the Colonels increased power off the boards. Last year's forecourt combination of Bob Ockenfuss, Bill Ryan, and Herb Kemp are all seasoned veterans. Bill Grick, Jay Reimel, and Bill Umbach, give the Wilkesmen excellent backcourt speed, both offensively and defensively. Rich Davis and Tom Kennedy provide the Colonels with bench strength, something unusual in recent years.

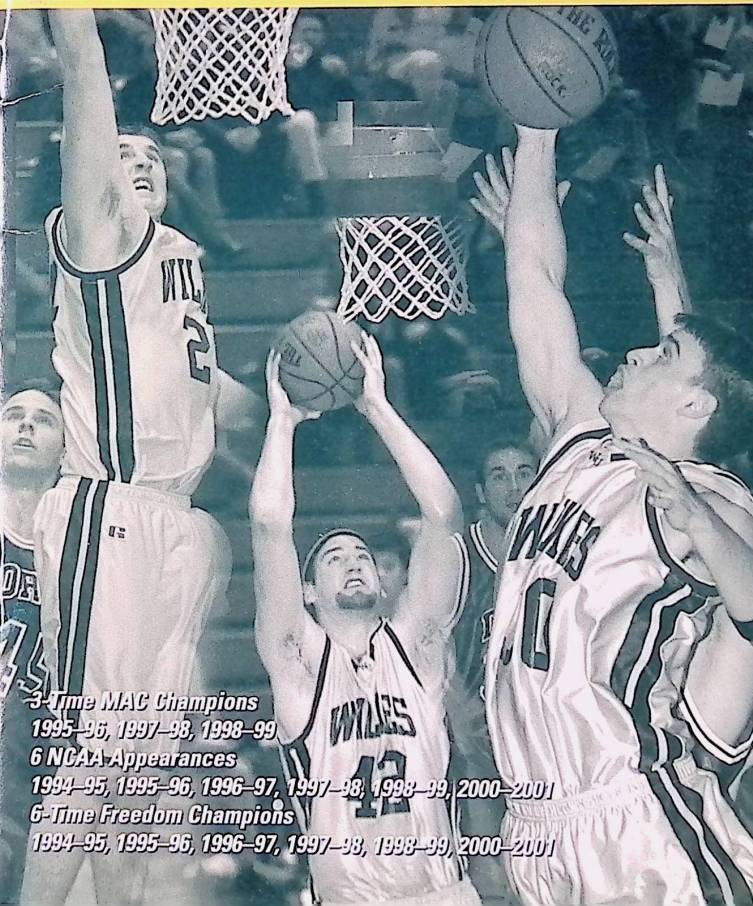

The MAC was formed more than 70 years ago as a loose confederation of colleges and universities before being unified into an actual playing conference in 1952.

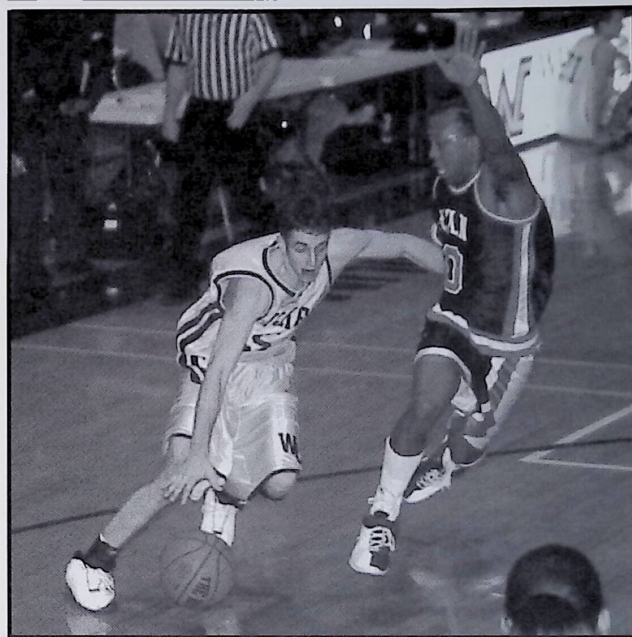

The MAC is now comprised of two conferences, the Freedom and the Commonwealth, and will compete in all sports including football. Also, the MAC operates under the leadership of an executive committee consisting of two presidents from each league.

Members of the **Freedom Conference** are: Allentown, Delaware Valley, Drew, FDU-Madison, King's, Lycoming, Scranton, and Wilkes. Members of the **Commonwealth Conference** are: Albright, Elizabethtown, Juniata, Lebanon Valley, Messiah, Moravian, Susquehanna, and Widener.

The MAC Freedom Conference and Commonwealth Conference champions will both receive automatic berths to the NCAA Tournament.

Kent Westling will call the action for the seventh straight year starting with the pre-game show 15 minutes prior to tip-off. In addition, all Wilkes men's home games can be heard on WCLH-FM (90.7), the Wilkes University student radio station.

HEAD COACH JERRY RICKRODE

In a span of eleven years coach Jerry Rickrode has taken the Wilkes men's basketball program from a struggling squad to a contender for an NCAA championship. During that time Rickrode has quickly ascended near the top of the NCAA Division III list of winningest coaches by percentage. His mark of .775 makes him the winningest coach in Division III with at least ten years experience.

Under Rickrode Wilkes has made six appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including a Final Four berth in 1998, and Elite Eight appearances in 1995 and 1996. The Colonels have also won at least 20 games in seven of the last ten seasons.

Rickrode was honored by the NABC (National Assoc. of Basketball Coaches) as its Mid-Atlantic Regional Coach of the Year after the 2000-01, 1998-99, 1997-98 and 1995-96 seasons. Rickrode has been named the Freedom Coach of the Year following the 1994-95, 1996-97 and 2000-01 seasons.

Rickrode came to Wilkes after spending four years as a full-time assistant at Ithaca (NY) College where he was in charge of coordinating recruiting and scouting along with assisting at practices and floor coach during games. In addition, Rickrode directed the pre-season and in-season strength and conditioning programs and was a full-time instructor in the Health and Human Performance Department.

Prior to Ithaca, Rickrode was an assistant at Utica College in 1987, a graduate assistant at Ithaca in 1986, and head freshman coach at Skidmore (NY) College in 1985.

Rickrode is a graduate of Skidmore College with a degree in Biology and Physical Education and from Ithaca College with a Master's Degree in Physical Education.

At Skidmore, Rickrode earned NAIA Basketball Academic All-America recognition. He was also named the school's senior athlete of the year in 1985 after establishing Skidmore standards for points and assists in a season and for career field goal percentage. Rickrode, his wife Kathy, daughter Jordyn, and son Christian, reside in Hanover Township.

HEAD COACH JERRY RICKRODE**ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH BRYAN McGRAW**

McGraw is in his fifth year as a coach for Wilkes, and his third as the Associate Head Coach. A graduate of nearby King's College where he spent three seasons as a player for the Monarchs, McGraw came to Wilkes after a one-year stint as an assistant at Division I College of Charleston. While at Charleston, McGraw was part of a program that was ranked in the top-25 throughout the season, earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, and notched a victory over the University of North Carolina. Prior to his experience at Charleston, McGraw spent one year as an assistant at Marywood University, and also served as a student assistant for the King's women's program.

McGraw, who received his master's degree in School Administration from the University of Scranton, is currently an administrator in the Scranton School District. He resides in Moosic with his wife Katie.

ASSISTANT COACH CORBY SWAN

Swan returns for his fifth season as an assistant for the Colonels and his third in a full-time capacity. In his role Swan is involved in every aspect of the Wilkes program, including scouting, recruiting, practice planning and game-day decision making. Swan was a four-year letterwinner for Wilkes during the early 90's. He played two seasons under Rickrode and was a member of the school's first Freedom League championship and ECAC Elite Eight team during the 1994-95 campaign. Swan earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Wilkes.

ASSISTANT COACH MATT MCCAFFREY

McCauffrey returns for his second stint as a member of the Wilkes coaching staff. He previously served on the staff from 1994 through 1998, helping Wilkes reach the NCAA Final Four during his last season. McCauffrey is back at his alma mater after spending two seasons as the head women's basketball coach at New York Maritime.

A 1994 graduate of Wilkes with a degree in Psychology and Elementary Education, McCauffrey was a three-year member of the Colonels squad and was a co-captain during each of his final two seasons. He currently serves as a member of the Admissions staff at Wilkes.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR ADDY MALATESTA

Malatesta is in her 15th year at Wilkes and her fourth as Athletic Director. Malatesta previously served as the head field hockey coach at Wilkes, a position she relinquished this past fall. She also had stints as both the head softball coach and Associate Athletic Director at Wilkes.

A graduate of Slippery Rock University, Malatesta also holds a Master's degree in Education from East Stroudsburg University.

Malatesta has been actively involved at both the conference and national levels during her tenure at Wilkes. She served as a member of the MAC Field Hockey Games Committee, and was also a member of the NCAA Division III Regional Field Hockey Selection and All-American committees. Malatesta also served a stretch as chairperson of the NCAA Division III National Softball Committee.

ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR PHIL WINGERT

Wingert assumed the role of Associate Athletic Director in August of 1998 after serving six years as the school's Athletic Director. A 22-year member of the Wilkes athletic department, he is also head coach of the men's soccer team which has made nine post season appearances under Wingert. He has a career record of 207-181-31, and led the Colonels to a record of 12-7-1 and a berth in the ECAC championships in 2000. He is by far the winningest coach in Wilkes soccer history.

A graduate of SUNY-Cortland, Wingert served as an assistant on the staff of Division I Virginia Tech before coming to Wilkes. He and his wife, Antoinette, are the parents of a daughter Laura and a son Robert. They reside in Wilkes-Barre.

ASSISTANT COACHES/ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION

A more seasoned Wilkes University men's basketball team will take the court this season. The Colonels, who have 13 returnees on their roster, will open their campaign on Friday and Saturday, November 21 and 22, when they participate in the Elizabethtown College Tournament. Wilkes will take on Adrian College (MI) in the opening round.

"This is an excitable group," commented Wilkes head coach Jerry Rickrode. "The positives with this team are that we have had several players step to the forefront and establish themselves as very good college players. We also have another four or five players who are on the verge of doing the same thing. We are more experienced than we were last season and I feel that our guard play is outstanding."

Leading the list of returnees this season is senior guard Dave Plisko. Plisko was a first team All-Freedom Conference selection last season after averaging 16.1 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game.

Senior Mike Morgan and sophomore Rashawn Pressley are also back this season. Morgan connected for 14.8 points and 4.4 rebounds per game last season. Pressley, who earned a starting berth during the second half of his rookie campaign, contributed 8.1 points and 4.3 caroms.

Another key factor for the Colonels is the return of junior point guard John Yanniello. Yanniello was averaging 10.3 points, 2.1 rebounds and 2.5 assists per contest through the first ten games before being sidelined for the remainder of the season due to an injury. Sophomore John Sclafani

and Drew Amoroso are also back at the point guard position. Sclafani played in 23 games as a rookie and chipped in with 3.1 points and 1.5 rebounds. Amoroso saw action in 12 contests a year ago.

Plisko, Pressley and Morgan lead a talented group of players who will battle for time at the wing positions. Junior Ryan Milford and sophomore Dee Henry will also look to fit into the mix. Milford averaged

2.8 points and 2.4 rebounds in 21 games as a sophomore. Henry saw time in 19 contests during his rookie season and contributed 2.3 points per game. Freshman Andrew Hack, who played his high school basketball at York Catholic, is also vying for playing time.

Wilkes also features an inexperienced post game, led by the tandem of senior Phil Bonczewski and sophomore Evan Walters. Bonczewski averaged 10.8 points and six rebounds as a starter a season ago. Walters played in all 24 games with ten starts as a freshman and chipped in 2.2 points and 2.6 rebounds.

Junior Joe Dorzinsky and sophomore Greg Cardamone also bring experience to the post. Dorzinsky played in 22 games last year and averaged 2.3 points and 2.5 rebounds. Cardamone saw action in four contests as a freshman, but is likely to see more time this season. Freshmen Tyler Jenkins from Rutgers Prep High School and Dan Adams from Hughesville High School will provide additional depth.

"This is the best team that we have had in terms of running our motion offense," stated Rickrode. "We are hoping to have a quick conversion offense that leads to a pressured defensive effort."

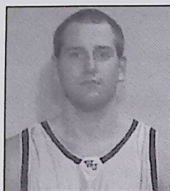
"Our 17-7 record last season was a bit deceiving because we were in position to win many of those games," added Rickrode.

GREATEST GAMES AT WILKES

FEBRUARY 26, 1996
MAC CHAMPIONSHIP

The Colonels captured their first MAC championship with a decisive 71-49 victory over the Crusaders of Susquehanna. Trailing 12-0 to start the game, Wilkes outscored the Crusaders 17-37 over the final 36 minutes of play. Seniors Matt LaBuda and Jason Turner scored 26 and 23 points respectively to pace Wilkes. The win capped an unprecedented clean sweep of the MAC for the Colonels, who finished 18-0 against league competition.

MARCH 2, 1996
NCAA SECOND ROUND

In what may go down as the greatest comeback in small college basketball history, Wilkes erased a nine-point deficit with 0:43 left in regulation to send the game into overtime, and then went on to top Cabrini College, 96-91, before a packed house in the Marts Center. Sophomore guard Jay Williams saved the Colonels season by burying four three-pointers in the final 0:43. His heroics earned him a spot on ESPN Sportscenter. Senior Chris Parker sealed the Colonels win by hitting four straight free throws in the overtime period.

FEBRUARY 28, 1998
MAC CHAMPIONSHIP

The Colonels claimed their second MAC title in three years by disposing of the University of Scranton, 83-75, in front of a capacity crowd at the Marts Center. Wilkes controlled the game from the outset, building a double-digit lead with just under three minutes remaining in the contest. Five Wilkes players scored in double figures, led by senior Mike Barrouk, who finished with 20 points. Sophomore Dave Jannuzzi added 19 points, while junior Scott Cleveland came off the bench to put together a double-double with 11 points and 14 rebounds.

MARCH 13, 1998
NCAA SWEET SIXTEEN

Wilkes, making its third Sweet Sixteen appearance in four seasons, held off Rowan University, 83-80, in double overtime to once again advance to the Elite Eight. Five Colonels scored in double figures, with sophomores Dave Jannuzzi and Chad Fabian, and senior Mike Barrouk each finishing with 16 tallies.

MARCH 14, 1998
NCAA ELITE EIGHT

A weekend of basketball that the Wyoming Valley will not soon forget came to a close as Wilkes earned their first-ever berth in the NCAA Division III Final Four with a heart-stopping 58-55 win over Hunter College. Wilkes, which trailed by as many as 16 points in the contest, cut the lead to nine at the half thanks to a basket by sophomore Dave Jannuzzi at the conclusion of the first period.

The Colonels came out of the halftime locker room with a rejuvenated attack. The Colonels held Hunter, which came into the game riding a 26-game winning streak, to just 22 points in the second stanza. Junior Brian Gryboski and senior Mike Barrouk both tossed in 21 points to lead Wilkes to the win. The victory, before a capacity crowd at the Marts Center, not only secured a spot in the Final Four, but also capped an unforgettable 17-0 record at home for the Colonels.

FEBRUARY 27, 1999
MAC CHAMPIONSHIP

Wilkes won their second straight MAC title and third in four years by posting a 66-51 win at Lebanon Valley.

The Colonels used a 25-8 run during a ten minute stretch of the second half to blow the game open. Chad Fabian, who finished with 25 points and six steals, scored 10 of his points during the decisive run. Fellow guard Dave Jannuzzi chipped in with 20 points for Wilkes.

The Colonels held Lebanon Valley's 6-9 forward Andy Panko, a Division III Player of the Year candidate, to just 15 points and six rebounds in the game. As a unit the Wilkes defense held Lebanon Valley to just 41 percent shooting from the field.

FEBRUARY 24, 2001
FREEDOM CHAMPIONSHIP

The Colonels captured the Freedom Conference title by knocking off Scranton, 86-81, in the title tilt.

Wilkes trailed 36-31 in the first half before closing the period with a 10-3 run. Tom Stambaugh had five points, Brad Sechler had three and Kevin Walsh had two during the upset. The Colonels never trailed again in the contest.

Stambaugh and Dave Jannuzzi led Wilkes with 19 points each. Jannuzzi also finished with 11 assists. Sechler and Walsh each chipped in with 18 tallies for the Colonels.

Junior point guard Rena Bolin returns to run the show for the Lady Colonels this season. Bolin was the second leading scorer for Wilkes last season and led the team in both assists and steals.



HEAD COACH JIM REED

Jim Reed begins his fourth season as head coach of the Wilkes University women's basketball team. During his first three seasons with the Lady Colonels Reed has led the squad to an overall record of 23-60. During the 2002-03 campaign Wilkes compiled an overall mark of 12-13.

A 1985 graduate of Bucknell University with a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering, Reed spent three seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater. His duties at Bucknell included assisting in practice planning and organization, scouting and planning game strategy, practice and game coaching, and serving as the recruiting and NCAA recruiting compliance coordinator.

During the 2000-01 campaign, Reed helped the Bison set a new school record for wins with 20 as the squad fashioned a second place showing in the Patriot League. A season earlier, Bucknell advanced to the Patriot League championship game for the first time in school history.

Prior to his stint at Bucknell, Reed spent three seasons as a volunteer assistant girl's basketball coach at Indian Valley High School. He served as an assistant coach with the men's team at Division II University of Indianapolis during the 1994-95 season. He also had two stints, one each with the men's and women's programs at Susquehanna University. Reed was a member of the women's basketball coaching staff at Susquehanna from 1989 to 1992, while serving in the same capacity with the men's program from 1992 to 1994.

ASSISTANT COACH KATE FRANKS

Kate Franks begins her first season as a member of the Wilkes coaching staff. She is a 2003 graduate of Bucknell University where she earned her degree in Management.

While at Bucknell Franks was a four-year starter for the Bison basketball team. She concluded her brilliant career with 1,244 points, 421 rebounds and 275 assists. She ranks sixth on the all-time scoring list at Bucknell, while also ranking fifth in assists. Franks connected on 151 three-pointers during her career to rank second in career threes. She also hit a school-record 66 three-pointers in a season. Her play helped Bucknell claim the 2002 Patriot League Championship and secure the school's first ever NCAA Division I Tournament berth.

Franks, who captained the Bison during her senior season, earned a variety of awards while at Bucknell. She was awarded the Lee S. "Bud" Ranck Memorial Award, which is presented to a Bucknell athlete for outstanding spirit and contributions to the athletic program. She also won the Iron Woman Award as the women's basketball player at Bucknell that best exemplifies selflessness and commitment to the team. Frank also earned the Bison Award that is presented to the women's basketball player whose dedication and devotion contribute most to the team.

Franks furthered her basketball knowledge by serving as a coach and counselor at basketball camps hosted by Bucknell, the University of Connecticut, Plymouth State College, Lock Haven University, Susquehanna University and Lehigh University.

ASSISTANT COACH SAMANTHA BEDFORD

Samantha Bedford joins the Wilkes coaching staff this season. Bedford graduated from Elmira College in 2004 with a degree in Elementary Education and a concentration in Mathematics. She also earned her Provisional Certification from the State of New York in June.

Bedford was a standout guard for the Elmira women's basketball team. As a senior she ranked third on the team averaging 8.5 points per game. Bedford also contributed 2.8 rebounds, 7.9 assists and 22 steals.

Bedford went to Elmira after starring in three sports at Windsor High School. She was an All-Conference performer in basketball, field hockey and softball, while also earning All-State honors on the field hockey field.

Head coach Jim Reed welcomes back five veterans from last season's team that struggled through a 3-21 campaign. Despite the lack of experience Reed feels that the 2004-05 Lady Colonels will be a much more cohesive unit.

"The players have put last season behind them and they are looking forward instead of back," commented Reed. "Last year's team did not have good chemistry and as a whole, I feel that we are in a much better situation this year. I feel that we have the potential to be a much better team this season."

"The biggest positive with this team is that we have very good team chemistry and an excellent group of leaders," stated Reed. "Senior Lyndsay Bey, who has overcome a lot of adversity, and junior Rena Bolin will serve as our team captains and have done an outstanding job thus far. With eight newcomers this season we are going to rely heavily on their leadership."

Bolin, who averaged 9.7 points, 4.2 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game a season ago, will get the nod at point guard for Wilkes. The Scranton Prep graduate started 23 games last season and possesses the ability to both score and create. Sophomore Katie Orr and rookie Lara Judson will also vie for playing time at the point. Orr saw action in 20 contests as a freshman and contributed 2.8 points and one assist per game. Judson, a junior who has played three seasons of field hockey at Wilkes, is an excellent athlete and has a strong work ethic.

Junior Andrea Kacprowicz is expected to get the start at the two-guard position. She saw playing time in all 24 contests as a sophomore including 15 as a starter and averaged 6.9 points, 1.7 rebounds and 1.2 assists. Freshmen Randi Corbo and Bethany Head are also battling for time. Corbo is an outstanding athlete with tremendous speed in the open court. Head, who was a starter on the Wilkes soccer team this fall, is an aggressive and tough player who will have to play catch up after joining the team at the end of the soccer season.

Bey is the likely candidate to start at small forward. She played in 21 games last season and chipped in with 1.2 points and 1.4 boards per contest. Junior Tristan Tkach, and freshman Katie Cappelloni will also see playing time. Tkach will move from power forward to small forward this season after averaging 1.2 points in 13 appearances as a sophomore. Cappelloni is a graduate of Bishop Hannan High School where she was a Lackawanna League second team all-star as a senior.

Senior Andrea DeMaranville returns at power forward after leading Wilkes in scoring a season ago. The Wyoming Valley West product averaged 13 points and 5.6 rebounds last season. She will be pressed for playing time by freshman Lacey Andresen, who was a first team All-Conference selection at Deposit Central High School in New York as a senior.

Freshmen Karyn Perestam and Tricia Fenton will see time at center. Perestam was a second team All-Metro performer at Binghamton High School last season and according to Reed has the potential to be one of the top centers in the Freedom Conference. Fenton played her high school hoops at Bishop O'Hara High School and has performed well during the pre-season.

"One of our weaknesses last year was our inability to rebound the basketball," added Reed. "We have really focused on that aspect of the game during the pre-season and feel that we are a much more solid team on the boards. We have better size and a more aggressive approach that I feel will serve us well."

"My number one goal for this team is to make sure that we play as a team. We need to continue to work hard and improve as we have done throughout the pre-season. If that continues I think that we can play very good basketball."

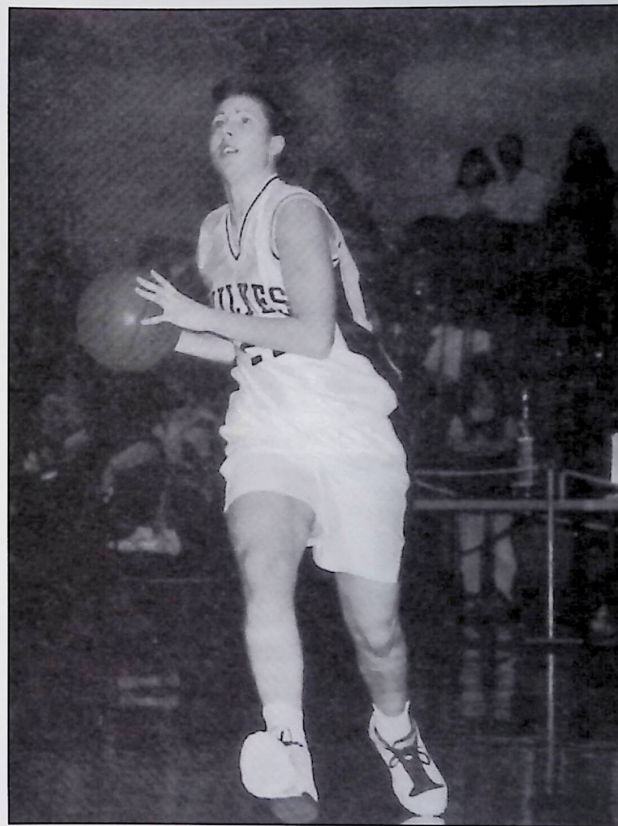
