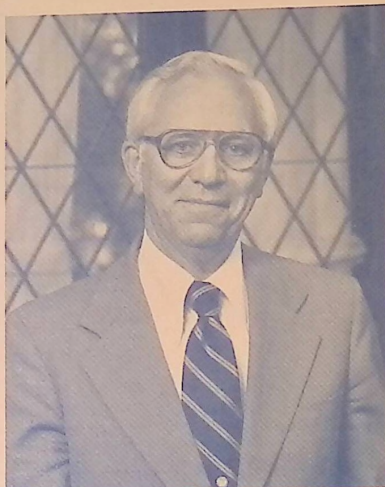

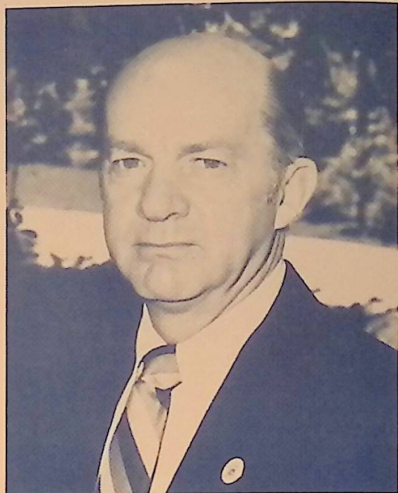
Wilkes College's Greg Hychko scoring on a 3 point play

THE COACH — JIM ATHERTON

Jim Atherton enters his second season as head basketball coach. In his first season, he directed the Colonels to a 13-10 season which was the best record for any first year basketball coach at Wilkes. Coach Atherton and his staff were awarded the Sam Schoenfield Award symbolizing sportsmanship and integrity by the area college basketball officials.

Before securing the Wilkes job, Atherton spent 12 years in the high school ranks and served as head coach at Luzerne County Community College for 13 years. While at LCCC he compiled an impressive coaching slate of 228-86 for a winning percentage of .776. His teams captured six conference titles and were involved in post-season play 11 of his 13 years at the helm.

Jim, who earned his master's degree from Scranton University, has been selected "Coach of the Year" many times. He has served as: President of the Eastern Pennsylvania Community College Athletic Director's Association; Chairperson of the EPCCAA's women's basketball committee; two terms on the Board of Directors of the Catholic Youth Center; and was awarded the National Social Service Medal from Brazil for outstanding service to that country.

Atherton was a high school basketball standout at Coughlin in Wilkes-Barre before moving on to continue his career at Wilkes, where he played from 1950-54 under George Ralston. Jim is a member of the all-time Wilkes College basketball all-star team.

Jim resides in Wilkes-Barre with his wife Patricia and four of their five children: Lynn, 21; Jim Jr., 20; Trish, 17; and Mark, 14.

COLONEL STAFF



ASSISTANT COACH — BART BELLAIRS

Bart Bellairs is in his second year as assistant basketball coach. He played both basketball and baseball while attending college in Asheville, NC. He was a standout in baseball and was invited to several pro try-outs.

Bart's first college coaching assignment was at Lycoming College, where he directed the junior varsity basketball team to a 14-5 record. In 1981, while working for his master's degree in athletic administration from Western Illinois University, Bellairs served as assistant in the basketball program.

He often speaks and works at sports camps during the summer (North Carolina, Massachusetts, Illinois). Bellairs is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

Coach Bellairs major responsibilities as an assistant include recruiting and scouting. Along with his basketball duties at Wilkes, Bellairs coaches cross country, assists in baseball, and is director of intramurals. On top of this, Bart is a member of the Physical Education teaching staff.

Bart resides in Parsons with his wife Laurie and their 10 month-old daughter, Katie Laurel.



ASSISTANT COACHES

TOM PIECZYNSKI: is in his first year as a volunteer assistant. A King's College graduate, he was head basketball coach at West Side Tech from 1976-81.

His playing experience includes four years at Central Catholic and two years at Luzerne County Community College, under Jim Atherton. Tom is a teacher at Luzerne Intermediate.

PETE DOYLE: earned his BA from Kutztown State and played his basketball in the Philadelphia Catholic League at Cardinal O'Hara and at Bloomsburg State College.

This is Doyle's first coaching assignment. He is employed at Offset Printing as a programmer.

1982-83 PRE-SEASON FORECAST

After losing four starters, most coaches might be looking to the future for some type of relief. Having graduated from the Colonel line-up are: 6-7 Kevin Walker, one of the leading rebounders last year in the MAC; Tony Madden, 6-5; Pat Romich, 6-4; and Paul Scaliti, who averaged 14 points per game.

Although Atherton has added 10 freshman to his roster, and would consider this a rebuilding year, he is not quick to count this season out.

Returning guard Greg Hychko, who played point last year, is expected to move to an off-guard, in hopes of increasing his 10 points per game production of 1981. Also returning is pure-shooting Rick Sheaffer, from Doylestown. Rick was a part-time starter for the Colonels and averaged 8 points per game. John Grochowski, a returning letterman, is expected to push for a starting role this season.

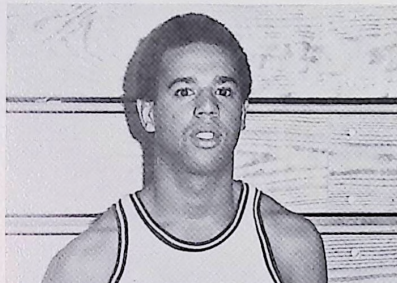
"Freshmen" is the word this year, but it is complimented by the word "talented." The Colonel starting line-up could very well include three freshmen. A probable starter is Jim Rodway, a point guard from Scranton's Valley View High School. Rodway has already assumed a leadership role which has been topped only by his raw talent.

Ken Yakobitis, 6-5 and a powerful leaper, offers Wilkes a quick center. Ken averaged over 22 points a game in high school.

Other key freshmen include: Tom Allardyce (20.8 pts/game), Pittston Area; Dave Zapotocky (21 pts/game), Hazleton; and 6-6 Dave Piavis from Nanticoke.

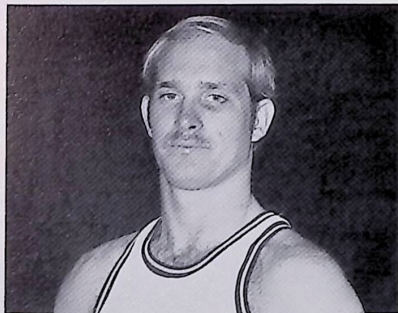
Although the Colonels lost their entire front line to graduation, incoming talented freshmen offer much quickness. The big question will be how quickly these freshmen adapt to college basketball.

HEAD COACH OF THE COLONELS BART BELLAIRS

Richmond, Kentucky native Bart Bellairs, at the age of 27, is one of the youngest and most exciting head basketball coaches in the country. He enters his first year at the Colonel helm after serving four years as an assistant coach at Wilkes College (1981-83), Western Illinois University (1980-81), and Lycoming College (1979-80).

Following a scholastic athletic career at Madison Central (KY), Bellairs played basketball and baseball at Warren Wilson (NC).

Bellairs entered the coaching ranks with a 14-5 record at Lycoming College as head of the junior varsity program. In 1981, while working for his master's degree in athletic administration at Western Illinois, Bellairs served as a graduate assistant in the basketball program.

Since coming to Wilkes in the fall of '81, he has served as assistant basketball coach, assistant baseball coach, head cross-country coach, director of intramurals and physical education instructor. Bellairs' major responsibilities as an assistant included recruiting and scouting.

Very active in the off-season, he organized and directed the first Hustlin' Colonel Basketball Camp, served as the shooting instructor at the Pocono Invitational Camp and has had numerous speaking engagements in PA and NJ.

Other camp experiences include UNC at Chapel Hill, University of Massachusetts and University of Illinois. Bellairs has also served as the director of the International World Series Baseball Camp in Williamsport.

He resides in Parsons with his wife Laurie and their 2-year old daughter, Katie Laurel.

Bellairs and His Staff Building the Complete Basketball Program . . .

When Bellairs took over the head basketball position at Wilkes College, his primary goal was to build a complete basketball program. A program that the school, players, and community would be proud of.

- Assisting players in finding summer jobs and jobs after graduation.
- Speaking in the community and throughout Pa. and New Jersey.

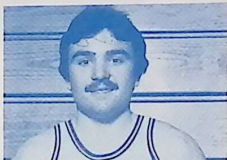

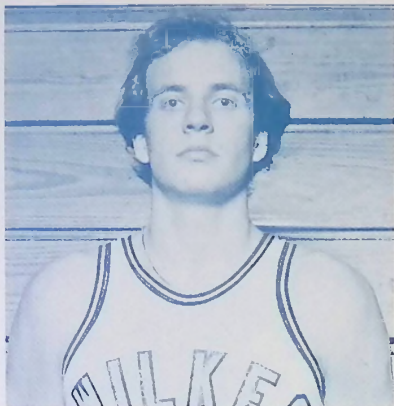

Majors and Degrees — Wilkes College awards the degrees of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.), Bachelor of Music (B.Mus.), and Bachelor of Science (B.S.). Majors include accounting, art, biology, business administration (with concentrations in banking and finance, economics, health care management, management and industrial relations, and marketing), chemistry, communications (with concentrations in broadcasting, communication theory, journalism, organization communication, or speech), computer science, earth and environmental science, economics, education (elementary and secondary education), electrical engineering, engineering management, English (with concentrations in linguistics, literature, or writing), environmental engineering, French, German, history/political science, international studies, materials engineering, mathematics, medical technology, music, nursing, philosophy, physics, psychology, sociology, Spanish, and theater arts. Individualized studies are also available.

Preprofessional programs are offered in dentistry, law, medicine, optometry, pharmacy, and veterinary science. 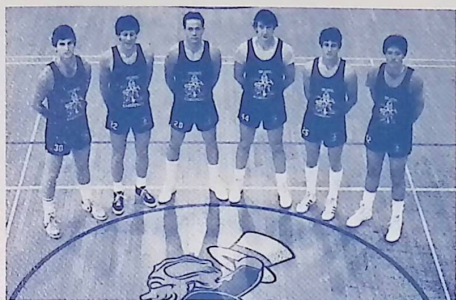

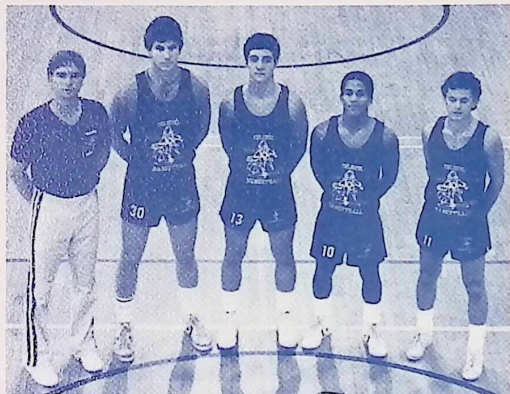
