THE COACH

RODGER BEARDE

Rodger Bearde begins his third season as the Colonel cage chief. In his first two campaigns in the collegiate ranks, the personable mentor registered a 25-23 record. In 1972 he led the Wilkesmen to their first Middle Atlantic Conference playoff appearance since 1957.

The Blue and Gold hardwood mentor is a native of Spring City and attended Springford High School where he participated in football, basketball, and baseball.

Later moving on to West Chester State College, Bearde had his collegiate career cut short by signing a professional baseball contract with the Pittsburgh Pirate organization.

His coaching experience includes two years as an assistant at Collegeville High School and six years as a head coach at Warwick High School in Lititz.

During his tenure at Lititz, Bearde coached squads posting an 84-38 record while winning three league and one Lancaster County crown.

Married to the former Adelaide Vandergrift of Manhawkin, the Beardes are the parents of three children.

THE COACH

JOHN G. REESE

John G. Reese starts his 21st season at the helm of the Wilkes College Wrestling Colonels. Over the years his teams have compiled an outstanding collegiate dual record of 185-32-6 including undefeated seasons in 1958-59 (7-0); 1960-61 (11-0); and 1970-71 (13-0).

During this period the Reesemen have also won 12 Middle Atlantic Conference championships and a runner-up trophy in the 1966 NCAA "College Division" tourney.

The successful Wilkes mentor has produced four NCAA and one NAIA champions. In Middle Atlantic Conference tournaments, 44 Wilkesmen have emerged as titlists.

A Wyoming Valley native, Reese attended Kingston High School, where he began his grappling career. While there the Blue and Gold head mentor achieved honors on the district level and was also a PIAA State finalist.

After attending Millersville State College, he completed his undergraduate work at Penn State University where he earned a B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1951. Since coming to Wilkes in 1953, Coach Reese has succeeded in building the Colonels into national prominence.

In addition to his coaching duties, Reese is also Director of Athletics at the College. A past member of the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee, he is also a former president of the NCAA College Division Wrestling Coaches (1968-69).

Other grappling affiliations include the United States Olympic Wrestling Committee and the governing board of the United States Wrestling Federation. Reese is also the inventor and developer of a new type of wrestling protective headgear, now being used extensively across the country.

John is married to the former Patricia Tosh of Wilkes-Barre and they are the parents of three children.

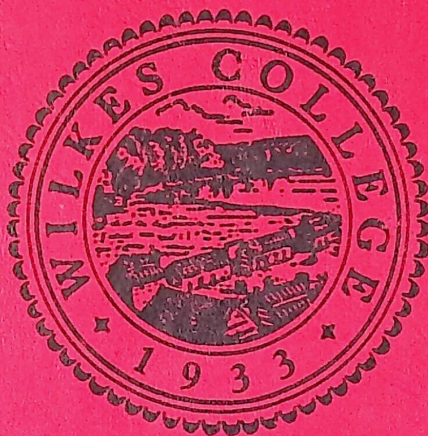

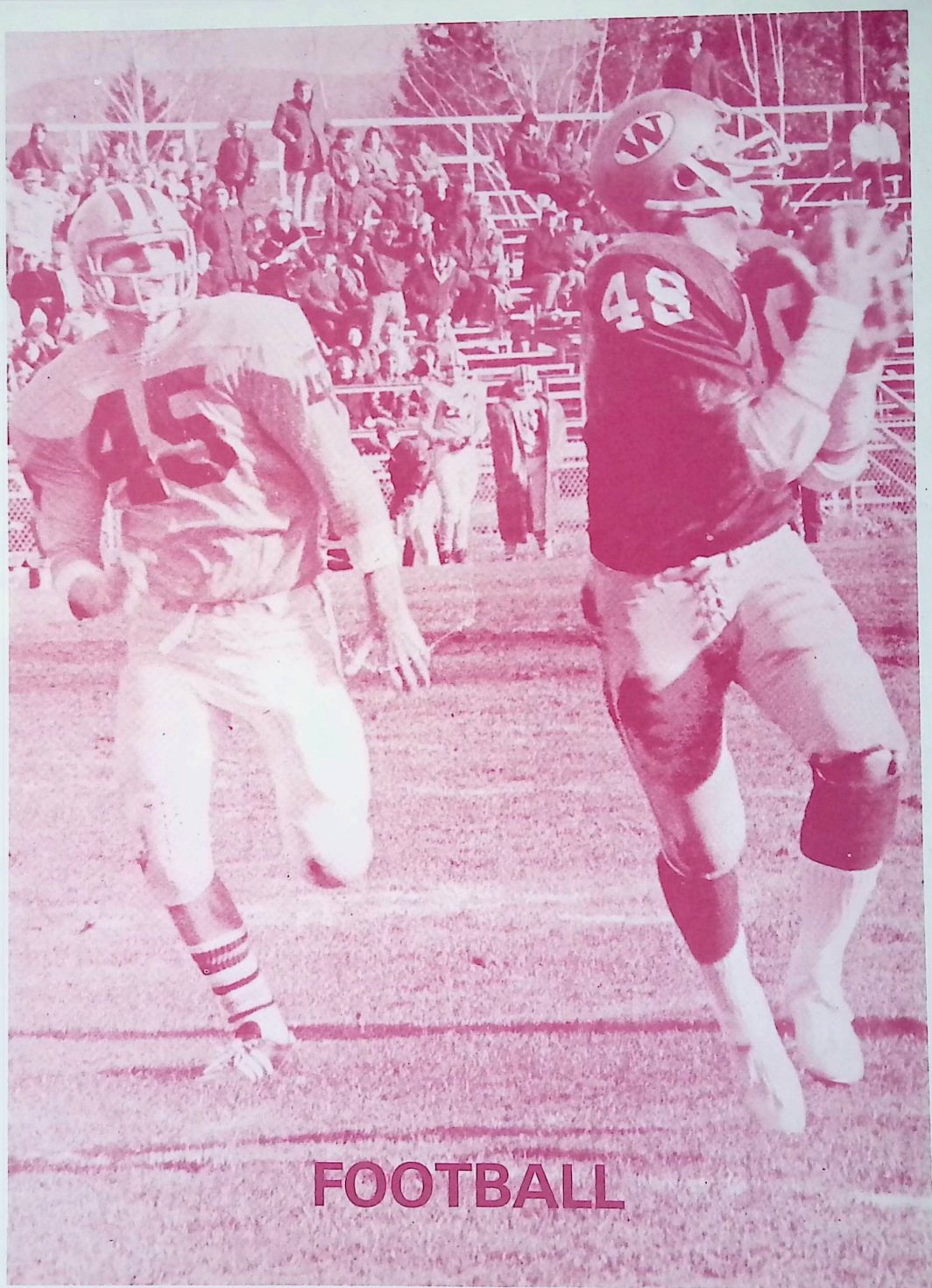

Rollie Schmidt begins his 14th season at the helm of the Wilkes College football Colonels. During this time, Schmidt guided teams have compiled an enviable 69-34-1 record.

From 1965 to 1969 his squads were the talk of the nation among college division football, copping 37 victories in 40 outings. Included in this impressive accomplishment were five straight MAC Northern Division titles (1965-69); two Lambert Bowls (1966, 68), symbolic of ECAC Division III supremacy; three consecutive undefeated seasons (1966-68); and a 32-game winning streak, the third longest in NCAA CD history.

Wilkes overcame a five-year drought in 1974 by capturing their sixth MAC Northern Division crown with a perfect 6-0 record. Not to be outdone in other fields of sport, Schmidt coached the Blue and Gold baseball team from 1962 to 1969, and in 1970 switched to golf.

His 1968 and 1969 baseball squads combined for a 22-5 record and won an MAC title in 1968. In 1971 and 1972 Schmidt's golf teams garnered back-to-back MAC links championships.

A 1950 graduate of Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School, Rollie participated in football, wrestling, and track. He later attended Bloomsburg State College for two years before serving a stint in the Army. Schmidt returned to Bloomsburg where he graduated in 1956. His coaching career began at Clarks Summit High School, where he served as head wrestling, and assistant football, and track coach. Schmidt put in another three-year tour at Kingston High School under Jim Fennell before moving to Wilkes in 1962. He is married to the former Margaret Dombrowski of Plains.

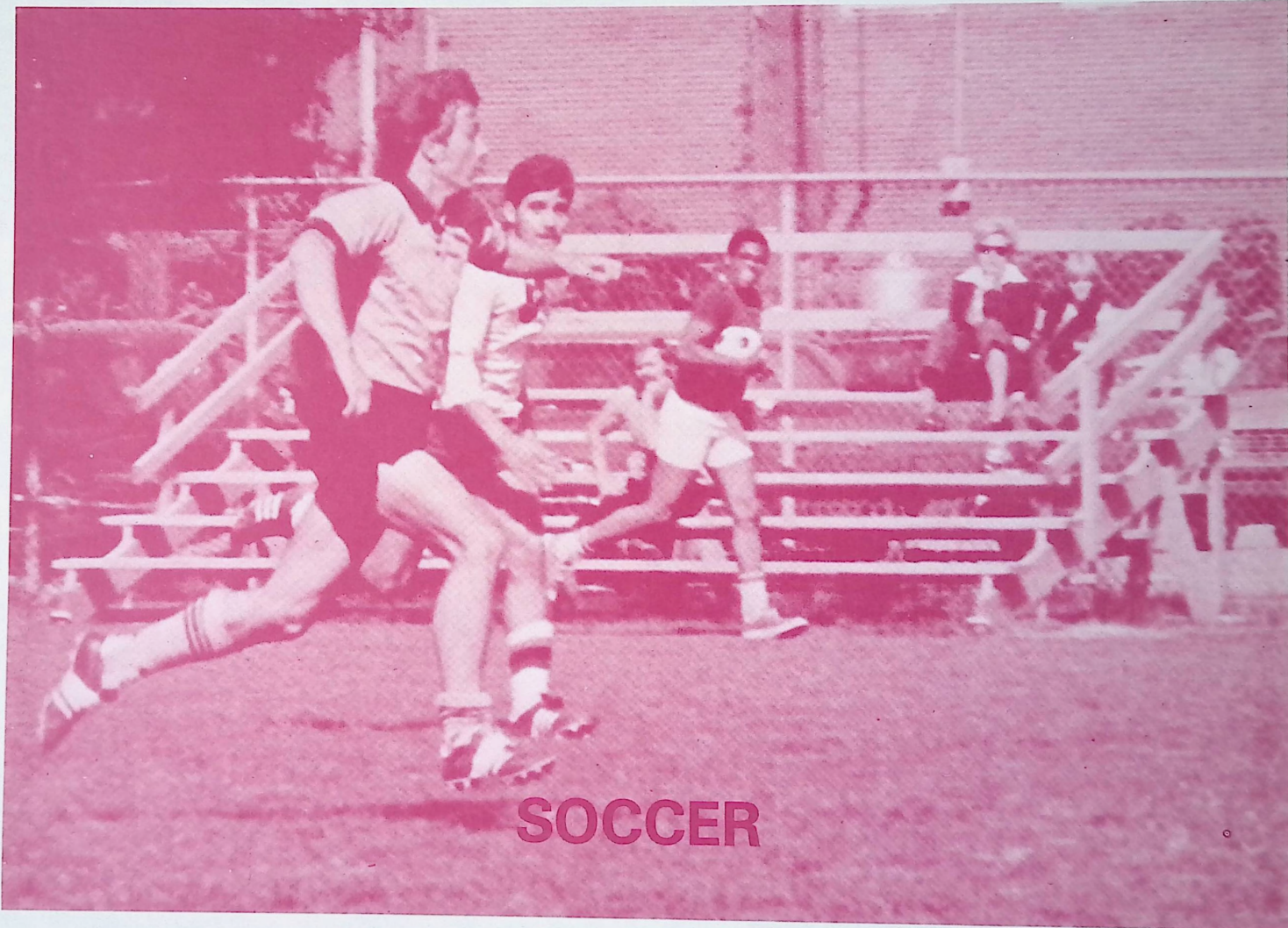

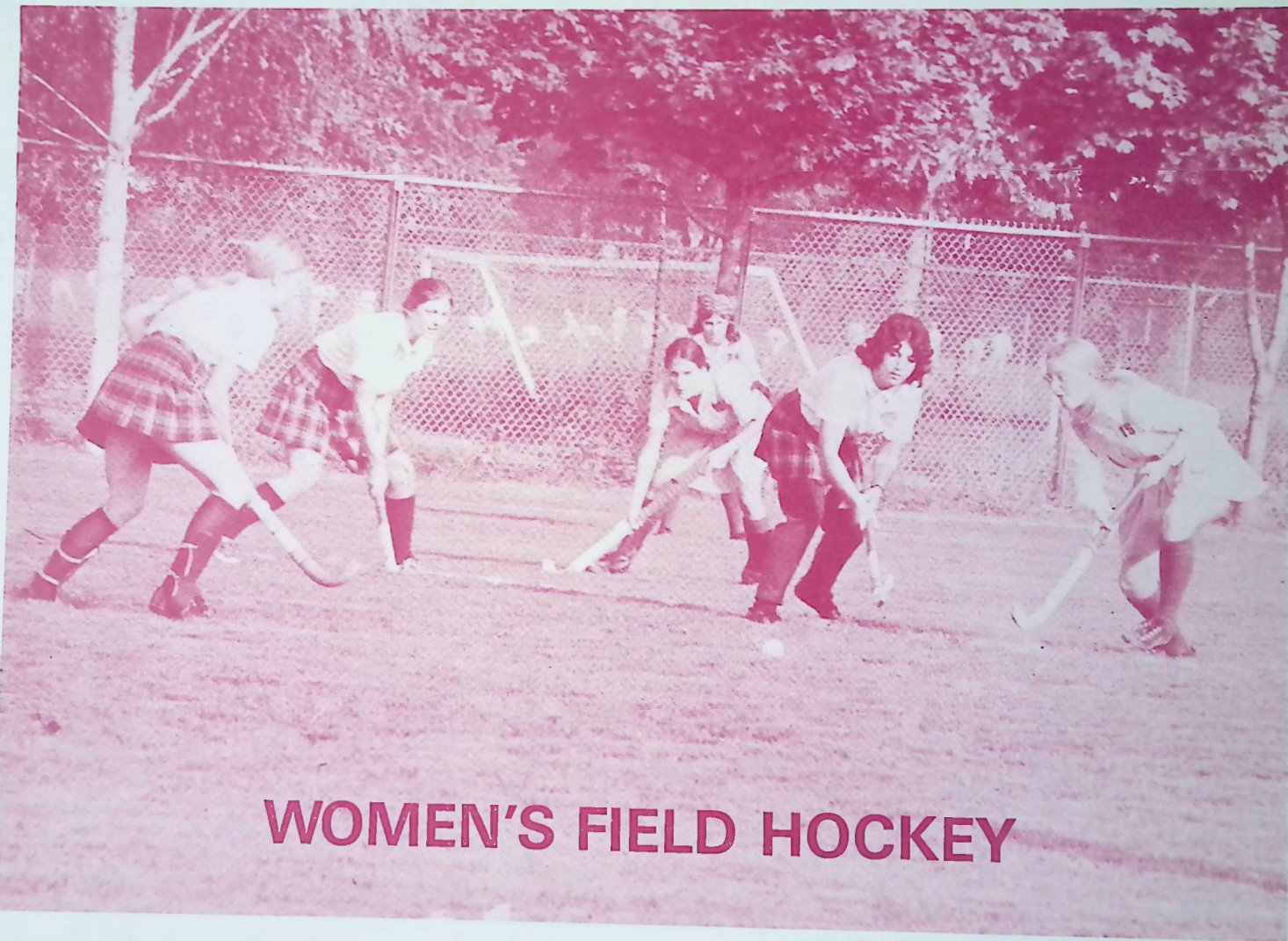

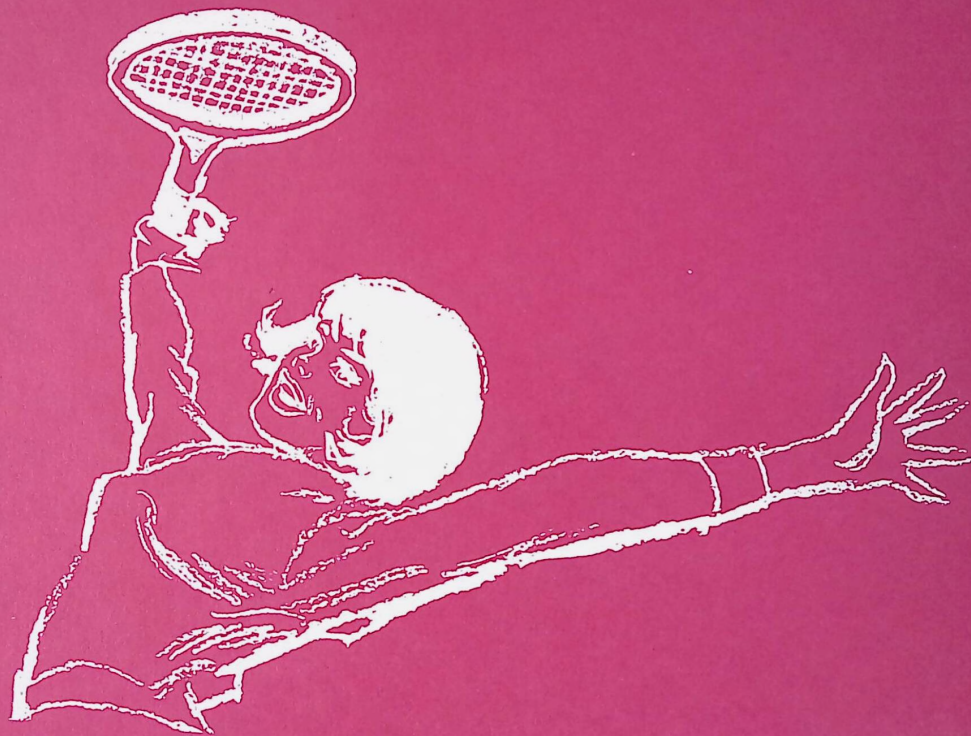
