HEAD COACH



ROLAND C. SCHMIDT

This fall Roland Schmidt will begin his tenth season at the helm of the Wilkes football Colonels. During the nine year span between 1962-1970, his teams compiled a 47-22-1 record which ranks him near the top among the nations college division coaches.

From 1965 to 1969 his squads terrorized the Middle Atlantic Conference and other eastern independents, winning 37 of 40 contests. Included in this impressive total are five straight Northern Division MAC titles (1965-69); two Lambert Bowls, symbolic of ECAC Division III supremacy (1966, 1968); three straight undefeated seasons (1966, 1967, 1968); and a 32-game winning streak, the third longest in the history of NCAA College Division.

Not to be outdone on other fields of sport, Schmidt coached the Wilkes baseball team from 1962-69, and in 1970 assumed the duties as the golf mentor. His 1968 and 1969 baseball teams combined for a 22-5 record, which included an MAC championship in 1968. Although loaded with underclassmen the past two years, Coach Schmidt guided the Colonel golfers to an 8-3 record in 1970 and went a step higher in 1971 by copping MAC Golf laurels.

A 1950 graduate of Wilkes-Barre Coughlin High School, "Rollie" took part in football, wrestling, and track. He attended Bloomsburg State College for two years before serving a two-year stint in the Army. Returning to Bloomsburg upon the completion of his military obligation, the Colonel head participated in football and track for the Huskies.

His coaching career began at Clarks Summit High School where he served as assistant football, track, and head wrestling coach for three years. Schmidt put in another three-year tour with Kingston High School as an assistant before moving on to Wilkes in 1962.
