

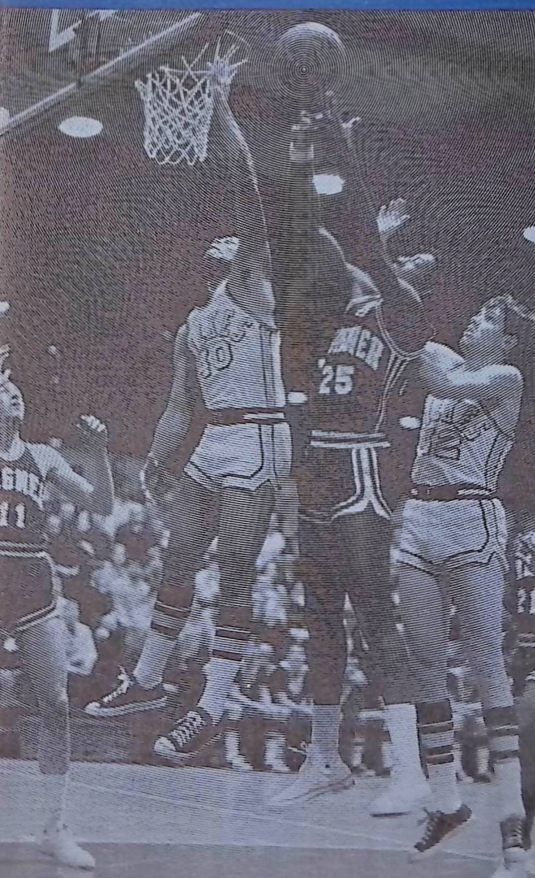

RON RAINEY

Coach Rainey will start his fifth season at the helm of the Blue and Gold this fall. Since 1965, when he inherited the head coaching reins, the young mentor has done a remarkable job in re-kindling spirit among the Wilkesmen. Last year the Colonels compiled a 13-11 log, their best since the 1957-58 season.

A native of Johnstown, Pa., Ron played three years of varsity basketball and baseball at Penn State University. After completing his undergraduate requirements, Rainey received his Master of Education degree in 1961. The Wilkes coach began his first coaching assignment at Chester High School and built a mediocre team into a state title contender. His 1965 team went all the way to the state semi-finals before bowing to the eventual state champions. His three-year total at Chester was 52-17.

In the fall of 1965, Coach Rainey moved to Wilkes and has succeeded in redeveloping a once-decayed cage program. His last two squads have posted back-to-back winning seasons. This has only happened once before in the 23-year history of the sport at Wilkes. Rainey is married to the former Rosabelle Kitzmiller of Harrisburg.

THE COACH



JOHN G. REESE

This season will mark the 17th that John Reese has been the head coach of the Wilkes wrestlers. Over the years his teams have compiled an outstanding collegiate record, 135-25-6, one of the top marks in the nation. Eight Reese-guided teams have captured Middle Atlantic Conference championships.

A Valley native, Reese attended Kingston High School, where he began his grappling career. As a high school wrestler the Wilkes mentor achieved honors on the district level and was also a PIAA state semifinalist.

After attending Millersville State College, he completed his undergraduate work at Penn State University where he earned a B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1951. Since coming to Wilkes in 1955, Coach Reese has built the Colonels to national prominence.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, the Colonel mentor is also Director of Athletics at the College. Earlier this year he was named to the United States Olympic Wrestling Committee. Reese is married to the former Patricia Tosh of Wilkes-Barre and they are the parents of three children.

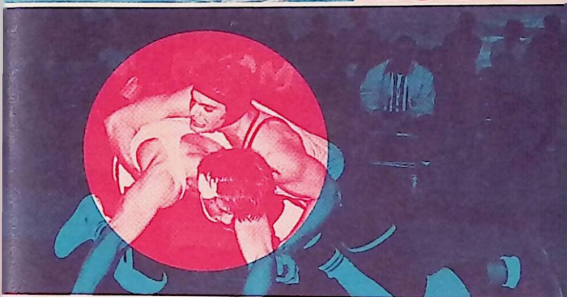

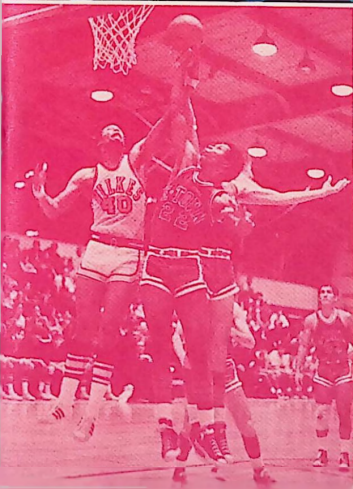

THE COACH



Ronald Rainey

Coach Rainey will start his sixth season at the helm of the Blue and Gold this winter. Since 1965, when he inherited the head coaching reins, the young mentor has done a remarkable job in rekindling spirit among the Wilkesmen. Last year the Colonels compiled a 14-8 log, their best since the 1957-58 season.

A native of Johnstown, Pa., Ron played three years of varsity basketball and baseball at Penn State University. After completing his undergraduate requirements, Rainey received his Master of Education degree in 1961. The Wilkes coach began his first coaching assignment at Chester High School and built a mediocre team into a state title contender. His 1965 team went all the way to the state semi-finals before bowing to the eventual state champions. His three-year total at Chester was 52-17.

In the fall of 1965, Coach Rainey moved to Wilkes and has succeeded in redeveloping a once-decayed basketball program. His last three squads have posted back-to-back winning seasons. This has never happened before in the 23-year history of the sport at Wilkes. Rainey is married to the former Rosabelle Kitzmiller of Harrisburg.

John G. Reese

This season marks the 18th that John G. Reese has been at the helm of the Wilkes College Colonels. Over the years his teams have compiled an outstanding collegiate record of 146-27-6, in addition to nine Middle Atlantic Conference championships and a runnerup trophy in the 1966 NCAA College Division Championships.

The Wilkes mentor has produced four NCAA and one NAIA College Division national champion. In MAC tournaments, 29 Wilkesmen have emerged as individual titlists.

A Wyoming Valley native, Reese attended Kingston High School, where he began his grappling career. As a high school wrestler the Blue and Gold head mentor achieved honors on the district level and was also a PIAA State finalist.

After attending Millersville State College, he completed his undergraduate work at Penn State University where he earned a B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1951. Since coming to Wilkes in 1955, Coach Reese has succeeded in building the Colonels into national prominence.

In addition to his coaching duties, the mentor is also Director of Athletics at the College. Last year he was re-elected to the NCAA wrestling rules committee. He is a past president of the NCAA College Division Wrestling Coaches (1968-69) and a member of the United States Olympic Wrestling Committee. Earlier this year the Wilkes coach was named to the governing council of the United States Wrestling Federation. Reese recently turned inventor and developed a new type of wrestling headgear which is now being used extensively across the country. The coach is married to the former Patricia Tosh of Wilkes-Barre and they are the parents of three children.

THE COACH

JOHN G. REESE

John G. Reese starts his 19th season at the helm of the Wilkes College Wrestling Colonels. Over the years his teams have compiled an outstanding collegiate dual record of 159-27-6, including undefeated seasons in 1958-59 (7-0); 1960-61 (11-0); and 1970-71 (13-0).

During this period the Reesemen have also won ten Middle Atlantic Conference championships and a runner-up trophy in the 1966 NCAA "College Division" tourney.

The successful Wilkes mentor has produced four NCAA and one "College Division" finalist. In Middle Atlantic Conference tournaments, 35 Wilkesmen have emerged as individual titlists.

A Wyoming Valley native, Reese attended Kingston High School, where he began his grappling career. As a high school wrestler the Blue and Gold head mentor achieved honors on the district level and was also a PIAA State finalist.

After attending Millersville State College, he completed his undergraduate work at Penn State University where he earned a B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1951. Since coming to Wilkes in 1955, Coach Reese has succeeded in building the Colonels into national prominence.

In addition to his coaching duties, Reese is also Director of Athletics at the College. A member of the NCAA Wrestling Rules Committee, he is also a past president of the NCAA College Division Wrestling Coaches (1968-69).

Other grappling affiliations include the United States Olympic Wrestling Committee and the governing board of the United States Wrestling Federation. Reese is also the inventor and developer of a new type of wrestling protective headgear, now being used extensively across the country.

John is married to the former Patricia Tosh of Wilkes-Barre and they are the parents of three children.
