ANTHONY LEWIS
Guest Speaker
The Max Rosenn Lecture Series

Pulitzer Prize winner, New York Times columnist, author, and Harvard Law School lecturer-teacher, Mr. Lewis is an internationally known expert in the constitutional rights and duties of the press.

Born in New York in 1927, Mr. Lewis won his first Pulitzer Prize in 1955 while writing for the *Washington Daily News*. That series of articles led to the reinstatement of a Navy employee who had been dismissed as a security risk, and became the movie theme of "Three Brave Men." As a *New York Times* staff member, his Supreme Court coverage won Mr. Lewis a second Pulitzer in 1963.

A 1947 Harvard graduate and Nieman Fellow for excellence in the study of law, Lewis has twice won the New York State Bar Association Press Award. Among his books are "Gideon's Trumpet," about a landmark U.S. Supreme Court case, and "Portrait of a Decade," about American race relations.

Anthony Lewis' background includes years as Chief of the *New York Times* London Bureau, Regent's Lecturer at the University of California Law School, Berkeley, and breadth of experiences making him a highly qualified guest speaker for this inaugural Rosenn Lecture.

The Max Rosenn Lecture Series was established in 1980 by the judge's former law clerks and friends in recognition of his tenth anniversary as a Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit, and in appreciation of his many contributions to the field of law, to the United States judiciary system, and to the quality of life in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
