Dr. Joseph J. Sisco

Dr. Joseph J. Sisco, former Under Secretary of State in Political Affairs and currently a partner in Sisco Associates, a national and international management consultant firm, has spent the better part of his life as a career diplomat.

Upon completion of his Ph.D. in International Relations with a specialization in Soviet Affairs, from the University of Chicago, Dr. Sisco's distinguished career included diplomatic appointments and offices under three United States Presidents — Ford, Nixon and Johnson.

An expert in Middle Eastern affairs, he served as Assistant Secretary for Near Eastern and South Asian Affairs from 1969-1974; as Principal Advisor and Negotiator on Middle Eastern Issues in the Egyptian-Israeli Cease Fire, 1970; and as U. S. Representative to the Special Session of the United Nations General Assembly in 1967.

Wilkes College is pleased to introduce Dr. Sisco, who also served as President and Chancellor of American University, to both the academic community and the community at large, through the Max Rosenn Lecture Series.

The Honorable Max Rosenn has served as Judge of the United States Court of Appeals, Third Circuit, for more than a decade. In recognition of his tenth anniversary on the bench and his numerous contributions to the U.S. judiciary system and to the quality of life in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the judge's former law clerks and friends have established **The Max Rosenn Lecture Series in Law and Humanities.**

A native of the Wyoming Valley, Judge Rosenn was born in Plains (Pa.) and currently resides in Kingston with his wife Tillie.

Throughout his career he has made innumerable contributions to the enrichment of the region. His contributions have spanned many fields, including law, education, health, religion and public welfare.

A member of the Wilkes College Board of Trustees since 1970, Judge Rosenn received his undergraduate degree from Cornell University and his LL.B. from the University of Pennsylvania. He also did post-graduate work at the University of California at Berkeley, and the University of Michigan.

The prominent and highly respected court official is a member of the American, Federal, and Pennsylvania Bar Associations, and serves as a consultant for the Pennsylvania Supreme Court Committee on Criminal Procedural Rules. He is an active member of the International Academy of Trial Lawyers, the American Judicature Society and serves on the Council of American Society of Law and Medicine.

The former Secretary of Public Welfare for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is a Life Member of both the Jewish Community Center, where he serves as a trustee, and the Wyoming Valley Jewish Committee. Following the flood of 1972, Judge Rosenn served his community as chairman of the Flood Recovery Task Force for Wyoming Valley.

Dr. Sisco's tenure in governmental service was consistently marked by honors, bestowed in recognition of his many contributions. In 1960, he received the Department of State's Superior Service Award; in 1966, he was named by the National Civil Service League as one of the ten outstanding career officers in government. In 1971, he was one of six federal career officers named as recipient of the Rockefeller Public Service Awards in the field of intergovernmental operations.

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The Max Rosenn Lecture Series was established in 1980 by the judge's former law clerks and friends in recognition of his tenth anniversary as a Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit, and in appreciation of his many contributions to the field of law, to the United States judiciary system, and to the quality of life in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
