New Endowed Scholarships

THE ALUMNI AND FRIENDS OF COMMUNICATIONS SCHOLARSHIP will be awarded annually to a communication studies major who has earned between 30-75 credits, who demonstrates service to the program, maintains at least a 3.0 grade point average (GPA), and who has a demonstrated need. Nominations accepted through self-nomination with short supporting letters from advisors or from communication studies advisors. Recipient(s) will be selected by the Department's faculty.

THE NORRIS CHURCH MAILER SCHOLARSHIP was established in 2004 by Mr. Norman Mailer, husband of the novelist Norris Church Mailer, other friends, and a gift from the estate of the late Gordon Smith. It is awarded annually to a graduate student in the Creative Writing Program who has both artistic promise and financial need. Selection is made by a faculty committee appointed by the Director of the Creative Writing Program.

THE ELIZABETH SANDISH MONTGOMERY AND GEORGE HERON MONTGOMERY SCHOLARSHIP was established by a bequest of Elizabeth Sandish Montgomery. First preference shall be given students who reside in Luzerne County, second preference shall be given to students who reside in other counties of Pennsylvania. The recipients must demonstrate good moral character and a superior level of scholarship as well as financial need.

THE O'HOP FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP was established by Paul A. O'Hop in honor of his wife, children and siblings. First preference is given to all non-exempt employees enrolled on a part time basis, or children of non-exempt employees of Wilkes University who are enrolled as full or part time students at the University and demonstrate financial need. Selection is made by the Director of Financial Aid.

THE LAWRENCE W. ROTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP, established with the Luzerne Foundation, was created in loving memory of Larry, son of Gene and Connie Roth, who died at the age of 35 following a brave and valiant effort to defeat the brain cancer that had afflicted him for nearly three years. Preference will be given to candidates who have interests in the legal profession, politics and/or community service. Further, preference will be given to students demonstrating a strong likelihood of exceptional campus involvement at Wilkes University.
