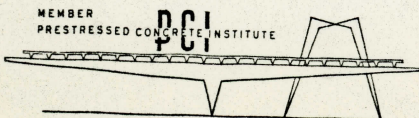
I would appreciate your evaluating this between now and the time of our next meeting on Thursday, December 14th, so we can discuss it in more detail at that time.

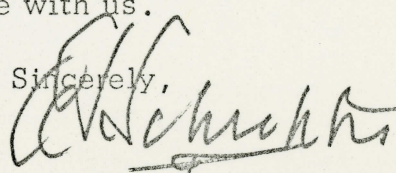
Dear Governor Shapp:

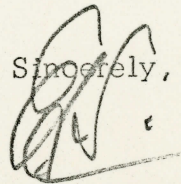

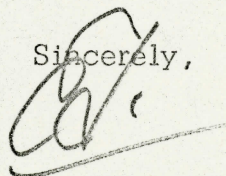
Dear Jake:

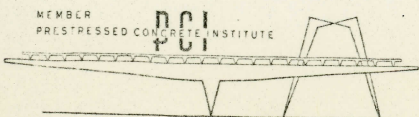
