Dear Sir

Under the impression that Mr John King may have been prevented from going to Harrisburg, whence he was to write to me, I make bold to recommend to you some business that is highly interesting to the Counties of Potter & McKean.

1st The reduction of the Subscriptions required before The Incorporation of the Comp^y for making a Turn-pike from Jersey-shore to Tendersport.

2nd A petition respecting the supervisors of Potter & McKean and other purposes.

3rd The appointment of Commissioners to report on the State of Improvement of the P. & W. Road.

4th The permission for aliens to hold a certain quantity of land.

I believe Bills have been reported on some, if not on all these Subjects. as the session is drawing to a close, and that I have not the pleasure of being acquainted with Mr Means of Lycoming, I make bold to request your attention to them, ^{by you} also that of Mr Means & of your friends in the house of Representatives if you & they approve of the objects in view.

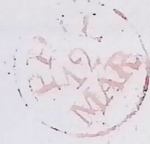
