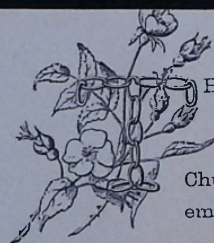

THE RIVER LEHIGH, NEAR ALLENTOWN, PA. (large picture opposite). This beautiful river flows south-eastward from Mauch Chunk to Allentown, thence north-eastward to Easton, where it enters the Delaware; about ten miles below Mauch Chunk it passes through a picturesque gorge in the Kittatinny or Blue Mountains, emerging from which, is the spot selected by Mr. Lewis for his picture.

Edmund Darch Lewis, born in Philadelphia, Pa., Oct. 17, 1837; pupil of Paul Weber, with whom he studied for five years. Up to 1876 he worked principally at landscape-painting, but since then has devoted himself to marine views. He received a first class medal, Centennial Exhibition, 1876.
