THE TRANSFER OF YOUR ACCOUNT DOES NOT REQUIRE ANY ACTION ON YOUR PART except to bring in your old pass book to the new bank at your convenience and exchange it for a new one.

Our Officers and Directors will be actively identified with the consolidated bank, and you will be waited upon by the same officials and employees as have heretofore served you at the People's Bank.

The banking room of the Miners Bank is now being enlarged and when these alterations are completed practically the entire ground floor will be devoted to the Banking and Trust business of the bank, giving ample facilities for the transaction of all the business of its patrons.
