 out Interest.

Order is taken this 22d Day of October, 1709. by Vertue and
 in Pursuance of an Act passed in Parliament, (Entituled, *An Act*
for Continuing several Impositions and Duties to raise Money by Way of Loan,
and for exporting British Copper and Brads Wire Duty free, and for Circu-
lating a further Sum in Exchequer Bills in case a new Contract be made
in that Behalf, and concerning the Ombis to be administered in Relation to
Italian Thrown Silks, and concerning Oyls and Plantation Goods of Foreigners
taken or to be taken as Prize, and concerning Drugs of America to be im-
ported from Her Majesty's Plantations, and for appropriating the Money given
in this Session of Parliament, and for making out Debentures for Two
Transport Ships in this Act named, and to allow a further Time for Registering
certain Debentures, and for Relief of Persons who have lost such Tickets,
Exchequer Bills, Debentures, Tallies or Orders, as in this Act are men-
tioned;) That you deliver and pay of such Her Majesty's Treasure as
 remains in your Charge, arising as well by the several Subsidies, Imposi-
 tions and Duties, by the said Act granted or continued, as by the Mo-
 neys which by an Act of the Fifth Year of Her Majesty's Reign,
 (Entituled, *An Act for Continuing several Subsidies, Impositions and*
Duties, and for making other Provisions therein mentioned, to raise
Money by Way of Loan for the Service of the War, and other Her Majesty's
necessary and important Occasions;) as also by one other Act of the Sixth
 Year of Her Majesty's Reign, (Entituled, *An Act for Continuing the*
Half Subsidies therein mentioned, with several Impositions and other Duties,
to raise Money by Way of Loan for the Service of the War, and other Her
Majesty's necessary and important Occasions, and for Charging of Prize Goods
and Seizures, and for taking off the Drawbacks of Foreign Cordage, and to
obviate the Clandestine Importation of Wrought Silks;) shall arise from and
 immediately after the Time that all the Principal and Interest charged
 on the respective Acts last mentioned shall be fully paid off and
 satisfied, or that sufficient Money shall be reserved in the Exchequer for
 that Purpose, unto the Hon. James Brydges Esq; or his Assigns, the Sum
 of One hundred Pounds, in Repayment of the like Sum by him lent upon
 Credit of the several Impositions and Duties by the said Act granted or
 continued, as also upon Credit of the Moneys which shall arise by the
 same Impositions and Duties, which have Continuance (jointly with
 other Duties) by the said former Acts, until the 1st Day of August,
 1714. and paid into the Receipt of Her Majesty's Exchequer the said 22d
 Day of October, 1709. as by a Tally bearing Date the same Day ap-
 pears. And these, together with his or his Assigns Acquittance or Ac-
 quitances, shall be your Discharge herein.

Order is taken this 22d Day of October, 1709. by Verue and Council in Purfuance of an Act passed in Parliament, (Entituled, *An Act for Continuing several Impositions and Duties to raise Money by Way of Loan, and for exporting British Copper and Brals Wire Duty free, and for Circulating a further Sum in Exchequer Bills in case a new Contract be made in that Behalf, and concerning the Outts to be admistrif in Relation to Italian Thrown Silks, and touching Oyls and Plantatin Goods of Foreigners taken or to be taken as Prize, and concerning Drugs of America to be imported from Her Majesty's Plantations, and for appropriating the Monies given in this Sijfion of Parliament, and for making out Debentures for Two Transport Ships in this Act named, and to allow a further Time for Registering certain Debentures, and for Relief of Persons who have lost such Tickets, Exchequer Bills, Debentures, Tallies or Orders, as in this Act are mentioned*;) That you deliver and pay of such Her Majesty's Treasure as remains in your Charge, arising as well by the several Subsidies, Impositions and Duties, by the said Act granted or continued, as by the Monies which by an Act of the Fifth Year of Her Majesty's Reign, (Entituled, *An Act for Continuing several Subsidies, Impositions and Duties, and for making other Provisions therein mentioned, to raise Money by Way of Loan for the Service of the War, and other Her Majesty's necessary and important Occasions*;) as by any other Act of the Sixth Year of Her Majesty's Reign, (Entituled, *An Act for Continuing the Half Subsidies therein mentioned, with several Impositions and other Duties, to raise Money by Way of Loan for the Service of the War, and other Her Majesty's necessary and important Occasions, and for Charging of Prize Goods and Seizures, and for raking off the Drawbacks of Foreign Cordage, and to obviate the Clandestine Importation of Wrought Silks*;) shall arise from and immediately after the Time that all the Principal and Interest charged on the respective Acts last mentioned shall be fully paid off and satisfied, or that sufficient Money shall be relieved in the Exchequer for that Purpose, unto the Hon. James Brydges Esq; or his Assigns, the Sum of One hundred Pounds, in Repayment of the like Sum by him lent upon Credit of the several Impositions and Duties by the said Act granted or continued, as also upon Credit of the Monies which shall arise by the same Impositions and Duties, which have Continuance (jointly with other Duties) by the said former Acts, until the 1st Day of August, 1714. and paid into the Receipt of Her Majesty's Exchequer the said 22d Day of October, 1709. as by a Tally bearing Date the same Day appears.
