said Recognizance of Twenty Pounds forfeited by
the said Luke Burton, and to discharge the said
Luke Burton out of Custody as to his Imprisonment
in respect thereof accordingly. And for so doing
this shall be your Warrant. Given at our Court
at St. James's this 5th day of April 1832. In the
second year of our Reign.

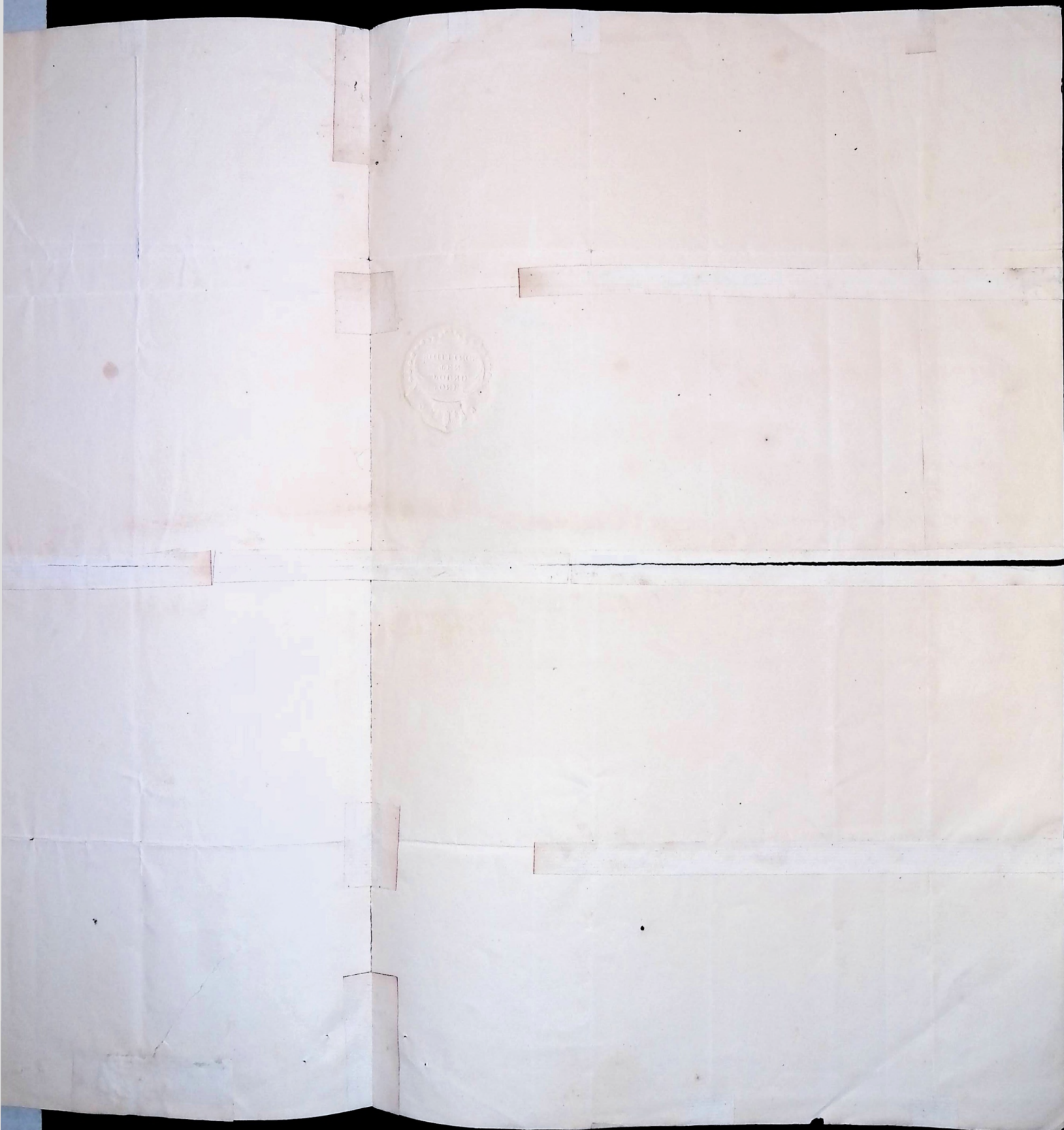

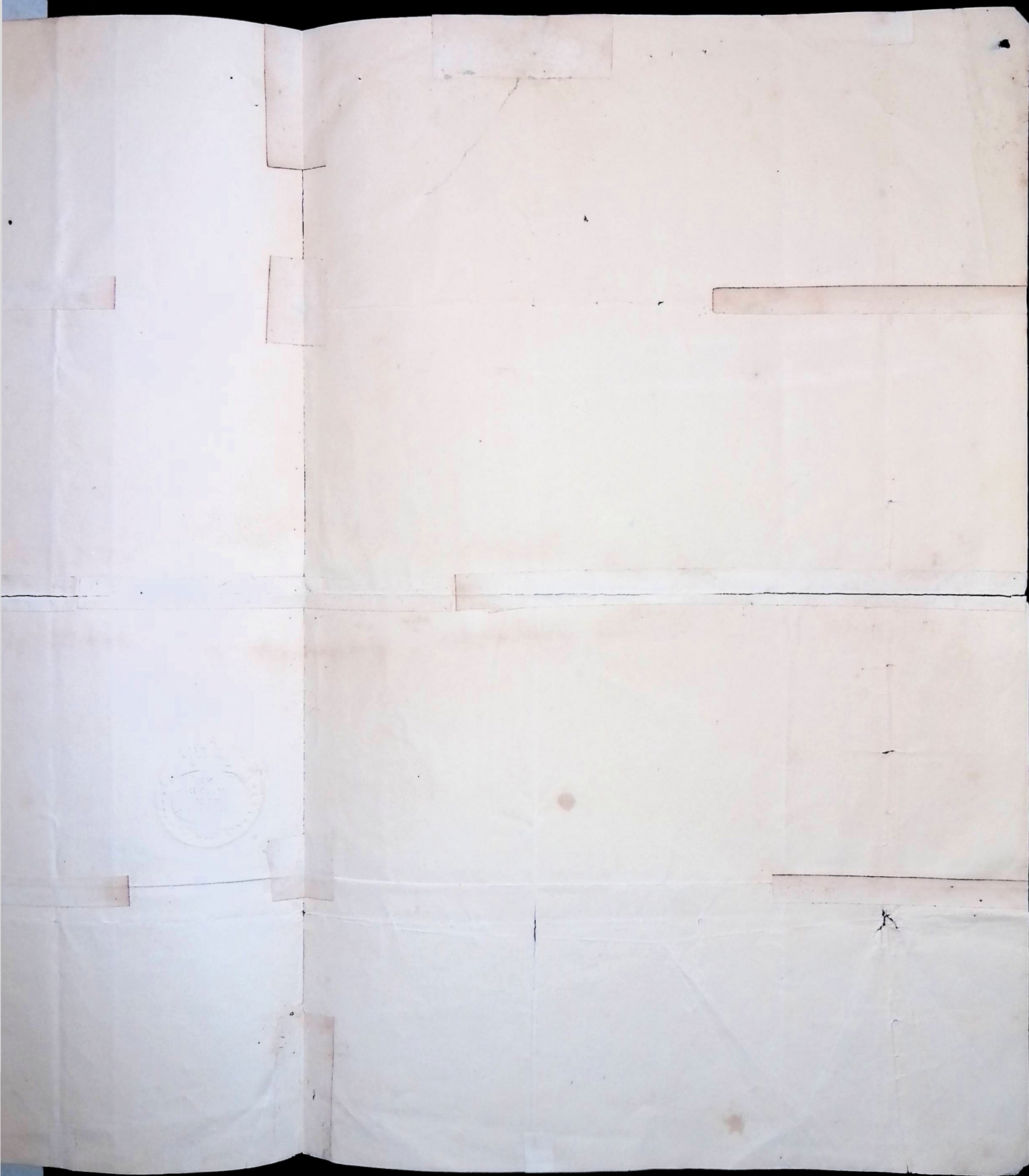

William IV., [1765-1837] King of England. 3rd son of George III. Rear Admiral 1790. Created Duke of Clarence 1789. Admiral of the Fleet 1811. Married Adelaide, Princess of Saxe-Meiningen 1818. Succeeded to the throne 1837.

Francis Thornhill Baring, 1st Lord Northbrook., [1796-1866] Called to the bar 1823. M.P. 1826.

A Lord of the Treasury 1830. Chancellor of the Exchequer 1839. Created a baron 1865.
