

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, ss:



Whereas, Isaac Vanburen,

of the township of Exeter in the County of Luzerne

hath applied for One hundred acres of land bounded as follows, Beginning at the South East Corner of the Township of Exeter, thence along the South line of said township to land formerly owned by Joseph Horsfield, and bounded by that tract of land on the West and on the North by lands unknown, on the East by lands of Andrew Henderson, until it strikes the Exeter line, thence to the place of beginning on which tract he has made an actual settlement & improvement, situate in said township in the county of Luzerne for which he hath paid into the office of the State Treasurer at the rate of ten pounds per hundred acres. Interest thereon from the 1st April 1819 to be paid agreeably to the several acts of Assembly in such case made and provided.

These are, therefore, To authorize and require you to survey, or cause to be surveyed, unto the said Isaac Vanburen, the quantity of acres by him applied for, at the place aforesaid, if not already surveyed or appropriated, and to make return thereof into the Land Office, for which this shall be your warrant.
