

DESCRIPTION OF WRIGHT LOTS 7 & 8

SAMUEL WRIGHT to HARRISON WRIGHT:

Beginning at a corner and thence by a part of lot 8 South 61 degrees East 108 per. to a corner, South 45 degrees thirty minutes, West 43 per to a corner--South 61 degrees East 106 per. to a corner, thence by part of lot 7 South 59° West 56 per. to a corner -South 57° 30 min West 18per to a corner South 51° west 20per 8tent to a corner, thence by lot 6 North 61 ° West 223 perches to a corner on the Susquehanna, thence along the same on several courses there of 141 per to beginning as per patent to Sam Wright 21 March 1808---Rolls office Patent book no. 64--Page 110 Containing 147 Acres and 103 perches--beside in allowance for roads etc, but after deducting 73 acres and 131 perches, previously conveyed by Sam Wright-- there remains 73 acres 131 perches.--- the above tract is called "Connecticut" being parts of lots 7 and 8 situated in first division of Pittston township.
