

Albert M. Clifford Dies At Nesbitt

Albert Morgan Clifford, 63, of 94 Staub Road, Trucksville, died this morning at 6:35 in Nesbitt Memorial Hospital, Kingston, where he had been a medical patient the past five weeks.

Mr. Clifford was born in Nanticoke, a son of the late Albert H. and Elizabeth Morgan Clifford. He attended local schools and was formerly employed as a letter carrier at the Kingston Post Office, retiring from the postal service in 1957.

He was married to the former Elvira Powell of Nanticoke, and they would have celebrated their 41st wedding anniversary in May.

Mr. Clifford was a veteran of World War I, having served in the Army with the 109th Field Artillery, Headquarters Company. He served in France for 22 months.

He was a member of Shaver-town Methodist Church; American Federation of Letter Carriers and Nanticoke Council 391, Jr. OUAM.
