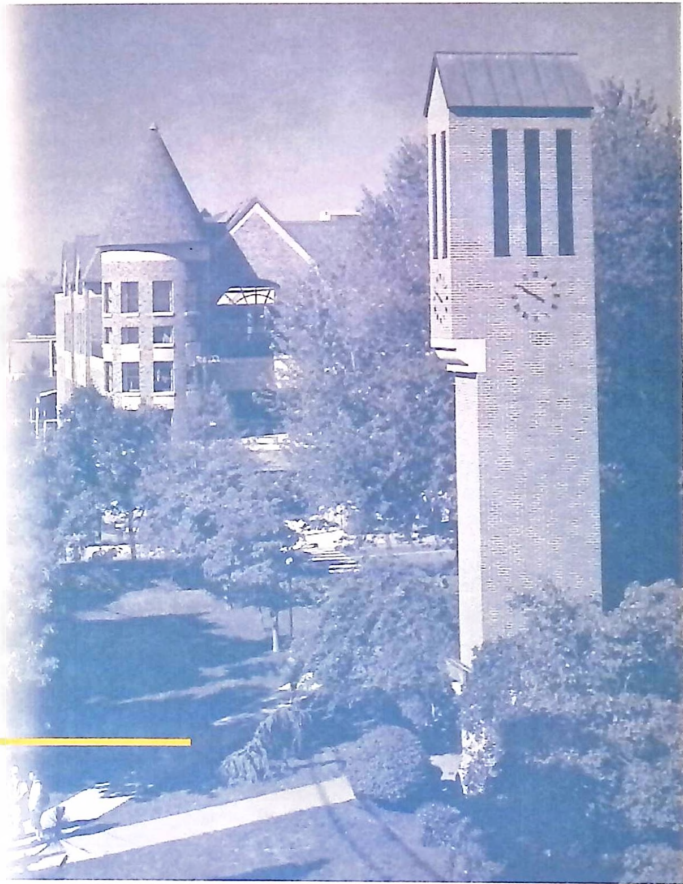

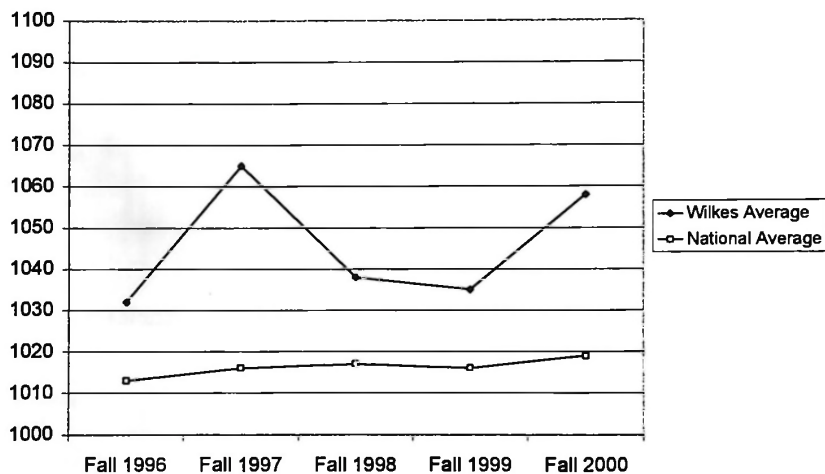

Trends in Combined SAT Scores for First-time Full-time Freshmen

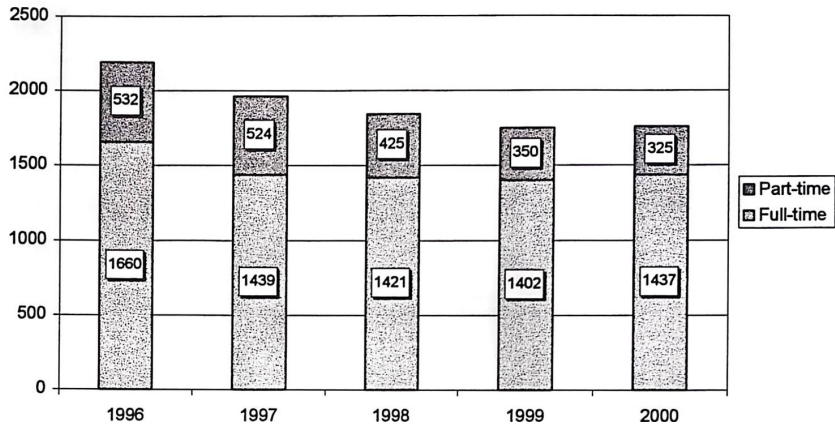

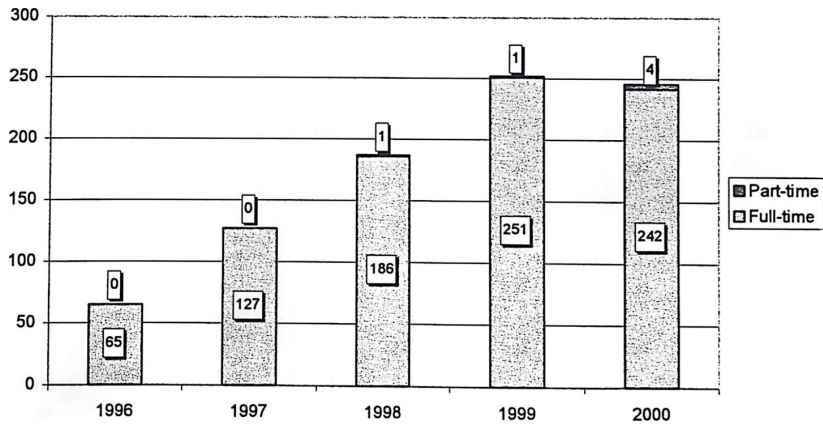

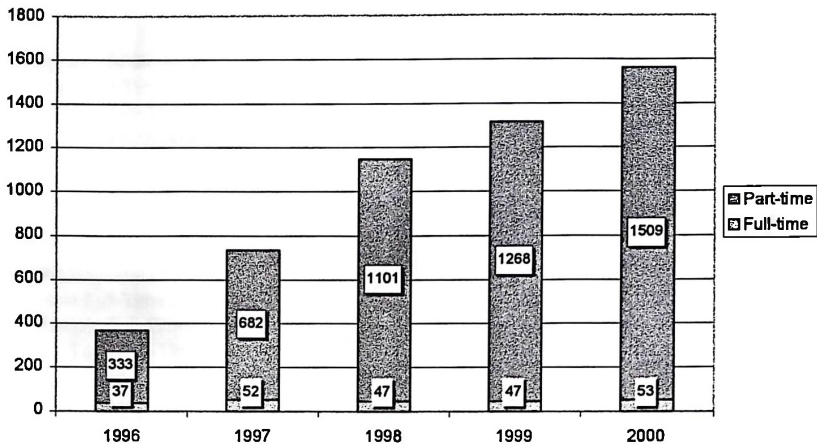
Trends in Undergraduate Enrollment Fall 1996-Fall 2000

Volunteer Service

Wilkes University faculty, staff, and students volunteered approximately 27,000 hours during the 1999-2000 school year. For the 1998-1999 school year, the Wilkes Community participated in approximately 29,000 hours of service, which ranked third in the nation.
