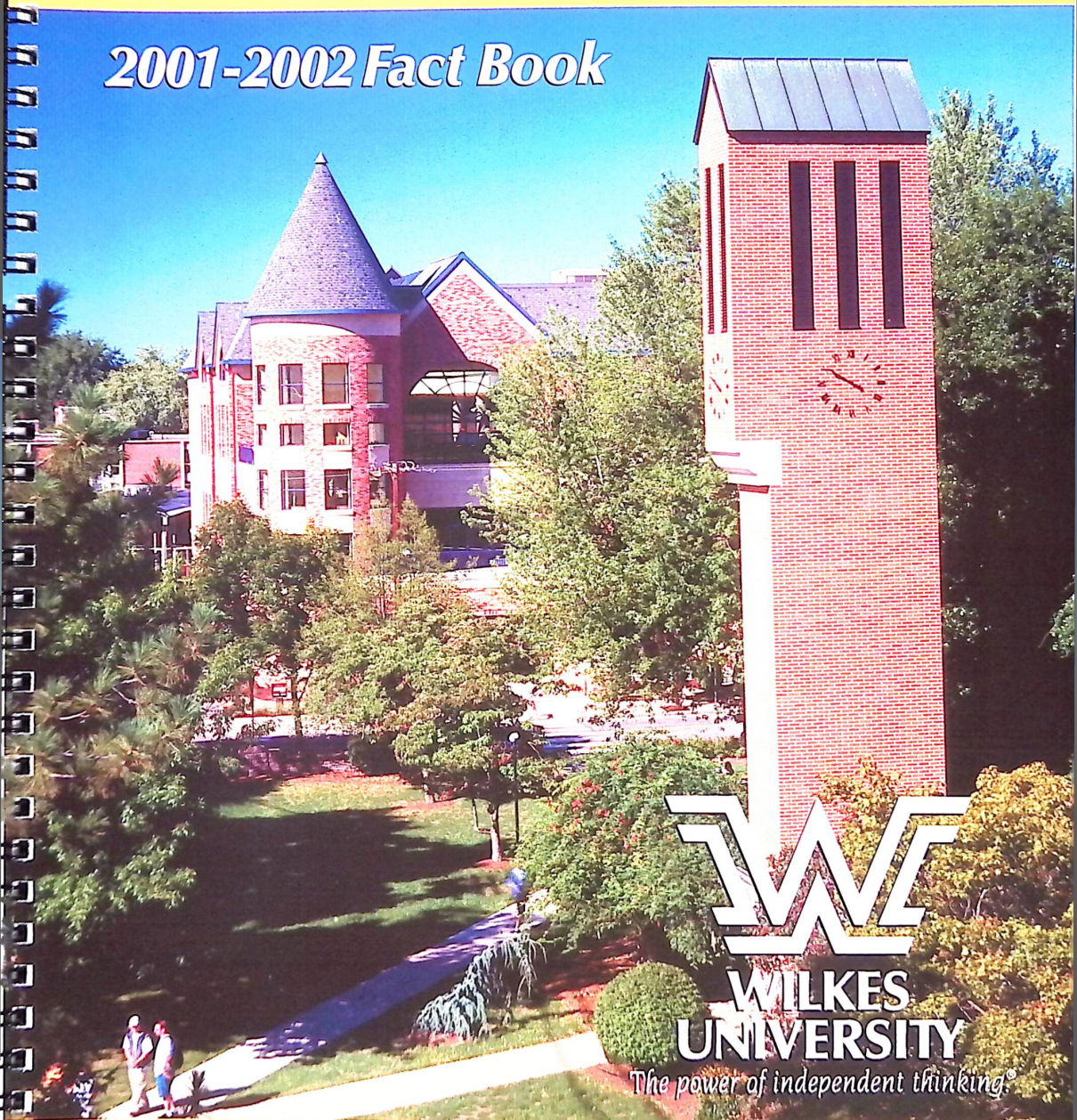

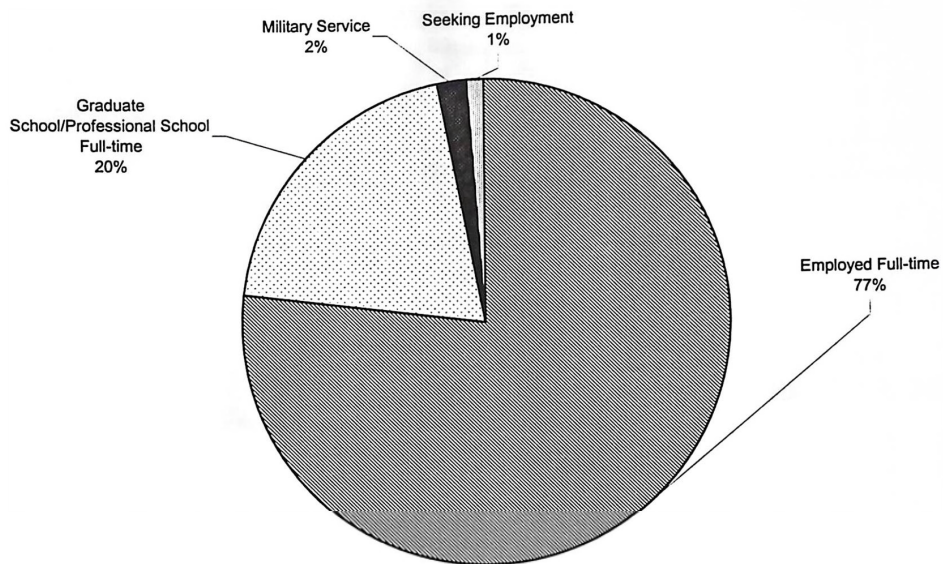

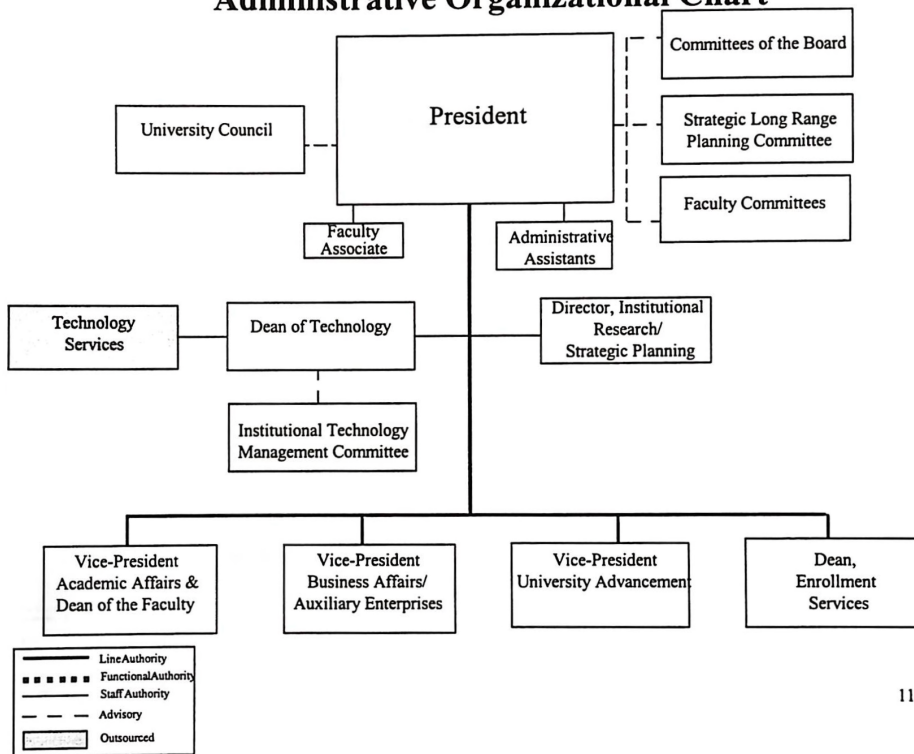

Administrative Organizational Chart

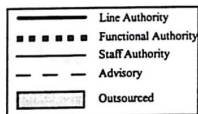
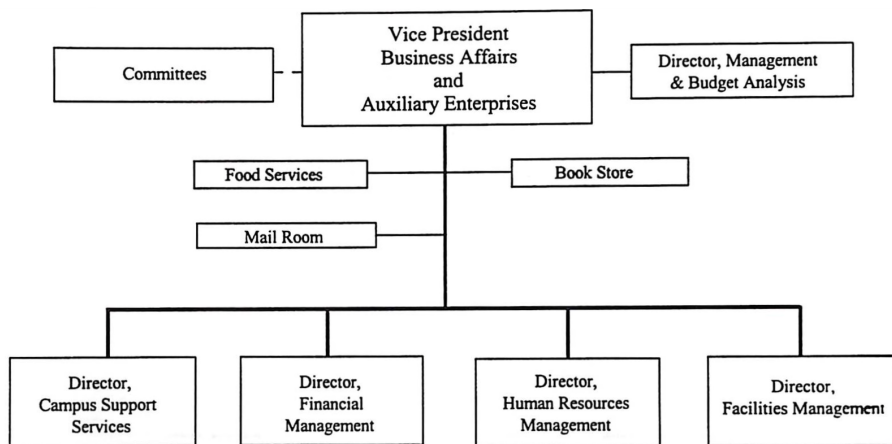
