President Milosevic spent the night fighting his thugs and his antiquated army to fight hugely destructive wars that he ultimately lost, but that whipped up nationalist fervor inside Serbia. They had kept him in power in a new Europe that has no stomach for dictators.

Equally odd were the rules. As President Clinton laid them down on Day 1: "I do not intend to put our troops in Kosovo to fight a war."

Because of White House skittishness about American combat deaths, NATO was obliged to do what had never been done: win a war without risking its own soldiers on the ground.

If the peace deal holds up, the curious war comes out this way: The bulky alliance won, but at a savage cost to the people who were supposed to be protected. Much of Kosovo has been razed, more than one million of its Albanian residents have been uprooted, and thousands of innocents have been killed. The West will have to spend many billions of dollars to rebuild what NATO bombs and the Serbs have destroyed.

The dictator lost, but he stays on in his shrinking Yugoslavia. If his bad habits hold and if the Serbs do not depose him, he may well cause trouble another day.

And just possibly a new lesson in war has been learned. Thanks to the wonders of high-technology weaponry, an overwhelmingly powerful alliance can crush a small nation's aggressive will without having to risk its own soldiers, if it is willing to spend enough money and if it can stomach mistakes that kill innocent civilians.

In the end it was a 72-day campaign of violent accretion.

As bombs did their work, diplomats from the United States, Western Europe and Russia ignored the West's oratory about Mr. Milosevic's being a latter-day Hitler and went about the delicate business of offering him an exit.

As the bombs did their work, Mr. Milosevic's forces did what damage they could in Kosovo; then he prepared his people for another lost war. As soon as he was offered a way to stay in power while losing, he jumped on it.

The Bombing Begins

'Lessons' of Bosnia Did Not Apply

Generals and politicians often learn the wrong lessons from the last war. The wrong lesson that American officials took from dropping bombs to end the war in Bosnia in 1995 was that Mr. Milosevic would fold after a few days of air strikes.

In a last-chance attempt to head off war in Kosovo on March 23, Richard C. Holbrooke, the United States special envoy to Yugoslavia, failed to scare Mr. Milosevic with the threat of imminent bombing.

On his way out of the country, Mr. Holbrooke was asked if he feared that NATO's air attacks would push the Serbs into ever more vicious "ethnic cleansing."

"That is our greatest fear by far, by far," he replied.

Asked what NATO, operating only from the air, could do to prevent a catastrophe,

Mr. Holbrooke went silent and shrugged.

The bombing began on March 24 and on Monday, March 29, in the Oval Office, the grim faces of the President's top foreign policy advisers, captured in official photographs and in the memories of participants, told the story: War in the Balkans was going to be brutish — and not short. Hundreds of thousands of Kosovo Albanians were being terrorized and bullied out of Kosovo by Mr. Milosevic's forces and NATO seemed helpless to stop it.

The President and other officials insisted in public that they had anticipated Mr. Milosevic's defiance and had expected his brutal ethnic assault on Kosovo.

But in private they acknowledged their shock, disappointment and miscalculation. "It's one thing to say we expected this," a senior adviser said. "But living it is not the same as thinking about it."

Not only had Mr. Milosevic refused to give in; Yugoslav antiaircraft gunners had downed an American F-117 stealth fighter the night before. The loss of the aircraft, one of the jewels of the American arsenal, was a propaganda coup for Serbia and an embarrassing display of the vulnerability of high-technology weaponry.

Mr. Clinton concluded that his top aides — including the Secretaries of State and Defense and the Director of Central Intelligence — needed an injection of fighting spirit.

"Guys, let's not lose sight of why we did this," the President told the group, according to one participant. "Let's not forget what prompted us to do this and who is responsible."

The responsible party, Mr. Milosevic, had been the principal provocateur in the collapse of Yugoslavia. He had orchestrated the bloodiest explosion of violence Europe has endured since World War II. During the 10-week war in Kosovo, he presided over a grisly forced exodus that outraged the world, and he was indicted by an international court on charges of war crimes.

But he is not a fool, and he had compelling reasons for fighting, many of which made popular sense in Serbia. Kosovo has genuine religious and historical meaning to 10 million Serbs. Peacefully surrendering control to the Kosovo Albanians would have been a national humiliation.

As important, at least to Mr. Milosevic, Kosovo was where he found his feet as a strongman. In 1989, when he was President of Serbia, he stripped the Albanian majority of its power by revoking the autonomy that the province had been given and tapped a deep vein of rage among Serbs who for decades had resented the influence of other ethnic groups in Tito's Yugoslavia.

At the Rambouillet conference outside Paris in February, after 12 months during which an armed rebel movement in Kosovo killed several dozen Serbian policemen and Serbs committed atrocities against civilians, the West presented Mr. Milosevic with what he and many Serbs regarded as a "capitulate or be bombed" agreement. "If there had been any 'cake,' Mr. Milosevic might have cut a deal," said Vuk Draskovic, then a minister in the Yugoslav Government.

There was no cake to offer, as Mr. Holbrooke, looking defeated and deeply worried, acknowledged on his way out of Belgrade. The next day, March 24, the bombs began to fall. To Washington's astonishment, Mr. Milosevic was more than ready for war.

For now, the document is useless, he said this evening after dinner as his wife yet again scraped the family dishes into a common trash heap for dozens of families who live with their tractors near downtown.

"We are just waiting for what the world will say to us," he said.

"We knew the problem of the U.N. would be exposed during the talks," said a senior European diplomat here. "Why, then, was the military encouraged to pursue the talks without the U.N.?"

Another Western diplomat, speaking in Washington, said that the Yugoslav military had been fully aware of the scope of the document and that the objections to the omission of the United Nations amounted to an excuse to stop talking.

"What I think is going on here is that the Yugoslavs want to have another go at negotiating this, but with the Russians and Chinese helping them out," the diplomat said. "They want this done in another venue, and take another crack at it."

Publicly, NATO military officials said today that the two days of talks with the Yugoslav military officers did resolve the basic aspects of the Serbs' withdrawal and NATO's entry into Kosovo. They refused to characterize the breakdown as a setback.

"It all worked on the level of military men speaking to military men," said Lieut. Col. Robin Clifford, the spokesman for the NATO forces in Macedonia. "What this exactly achieved is that firstly we met and started this discussion process. We know now where each other is coming from."

The talks stalled on Sunday after a second day in which both sides reviewed the document covering the proposed terms of the Serbian withdrawal and replacement by a NATO-led force. After 17 hours, the Yugoslav delegation refused to sign without some form of United Nations mandate.

Several military officials and diplomats suggested today that the problem could have been predicted. They said anyone who has ever negotiated with Mr. Milosevic would never have expected him to sign off on a document presented on a take-it-or-leave-it basis.

As a senior Western official put it, "He's got to have some fig leaf to explain to his people why they had to endure two and a half months of bombing that has ruined their country for an agreement that looks an awful lot like the one that was rejected before the bombing started."

This afternoon, George Robertson, the British Minister of Defense, made a hastily arranged visit to Skopje for talks with Lieut. Gen. Sir Mike Jackson, the commander of NATO's peacekeeping force for Kosovo.

Those talks were expected to center on the strategy for persuading Mr. Milosevic to accept terms for withdrawal from Kosovo soon.

However the politicians resolve the United Nations issue, NATO will command the 50,000 soldiers in peacekeeping force. Nearly 16,000 of them have been deployed here over the past two months and are prepared to enter Kosovo as soon as an agreement is reached.

NATO officials said here today that they did not believe they had lost the momentum for a peace settlement. In spite of the collapse of the military talks Sunday, NATO and Yugoslav military officials had a short "exchange of information" meeting today.

"Having established the contact," Colonel Clifford said, "the one thing we are very keen to do is to keep these lines of communication open."

The civilians of Jazince called for retaliatory bombing against the Serbs and a greater NATO presence. This afternoon, a grim procession of men walked their wives and children out of the picturesque village of 1,300. Among them were some of 300 refugees from Kosovo who had been taken in by residents after having fled to Macedonia. A refugee who is six months pregnant, Fikrije Burnike, 27, said she endured a 24-hour hike from Kosovo with her husband and two children three weeks ago. But now it has found her here.

"I escaped from there and now I have to escape from here," Mrs. Burnike said as she walked out of Jazince. "Nowhere are you safe."
