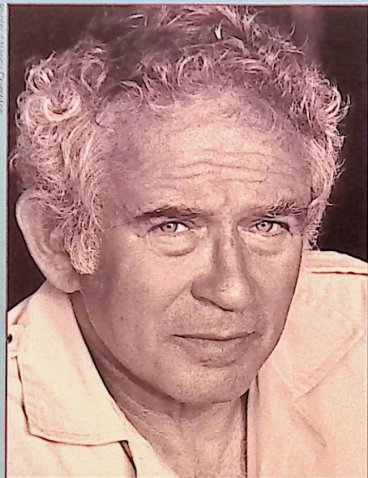

Fiction and non-fiction writers can apply for the 28-day fellowship centered at Norman Mailer's former home in Provincetown. This program is administered by the Michener Center for Writers and the Harry Ransom Center at the University of Texas at Austin. The Colony will provide spacious housing and living expenses for the July residency and a stipend to cover travel.

A number of distinguished writers and editors will visit during the fellowship and workshop programs and share their professional experiences with attendees while they are in residence.
