- 3 Wilkes University's **School of Pharmacy** occupies the first and third floors of the newly remodeled Stark Learning Center. The school's new facilities include a pharmacy information center, computer laboratories, a model pharmacy, anatomy and physiology labs, a pharmaceuticals lab, three research labs, conference rooms, offices, and accessory rooms.

The full pharmacy program requires at least six years of post-secondary education, including two years of pre-pharmacy study and four years of professional study. Eighty pre-pharmacy students are accepted each year into the pre-pharmacy program, with 65 admitted into the professional pharmacy program. The pharmacy program was recently granted candidate status, the next step toward accreditation by the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education. Wilkes's first doctor of pharmacy class will graduate in the year 2000.



- 4 Students in the **School of Science and Engineering** experience a unique integrated curriculum consisting of a complimentary array of courses, personalized faculty attention, a low student to faculty ratio, ample time for hands-on access to state-of-the-art laboratories, interaction with industry, and multi-disciplinary team approach to problem solving.

The University's Mechanical Engineering and Environmental Engineering programs recently were accredited by the Engineering Accreditation Commission of the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology. (The Electrical Engineering and Materials Engineering programs are also accredited by ABET.) Ninety-five percent of our engineering graduates are entering graduate school or working in their chosen fields within six months of graduation.



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- 5 The **Thomas P. Shelburne Telecommunications Center** is a new 13-room, 5,500 square foot facility featuring two full-sized production studios, three editing booths and various classroom, offices, and engineering control rooms. From the first-class design to the state-of-the-art equipment, our students now receive everything they need to effectively compete for jobs in television. Students currently coordinate two weekly television shows: WOW!, an educational show for children, and "Colonels Corner," a weekly half-hour sports talk show that airs on local cable TV systems.

The **School of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences** includes the departments of Art, Communications, Education, English, Foreign Languages, History, Music/Theatre and Dance, Nursing, Philosophy, Phys. Ed and Psychology. Students have access to state-of-art computer equipment, as well as the newly renovated Dorothy Dickson Dart Center for the Performing Arts.
