The Queen's Cup: Presented by the President and Mrs. Eisenhower, in the name of the people of the United States, to Queen Elizabeth II and The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, on the occasion of the royal visit, October, 1957.

The Queen's Cup

THE QUEEN'S CUP, shown on the opposite page, bears on its cover the royal cipher of Queen Elizabeth II.

The over-all engraving, designed by Bruce Moore, represents flora and fauna of the State of Virginia, in honor of Her Majesty's

visit to Jamestown in October of 1957.

At the upper center appears the state bird, the cardinal. Native wild flowers and rosettes of dogwood circle the rim.

Around the center are five Virginian trees, with details of their flowers and fruit. Birds

and animals of the region are engraved around the base of the cup.
