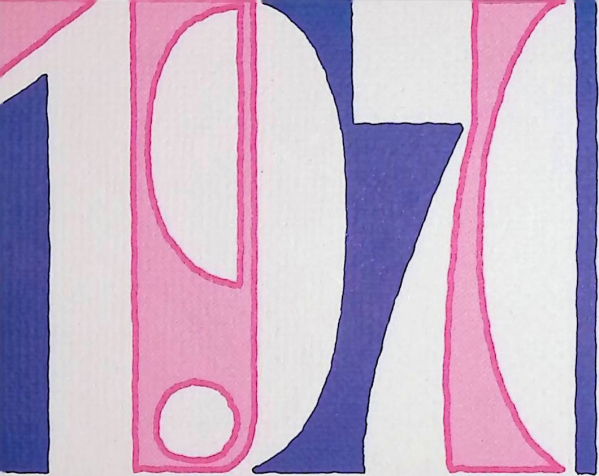

WILKES COLLEGE had its beginning in 1933 as Bucknell Junior College when a handful of students pursued a higher education in one rented building. Chartered in 1947 as an independent, liberal arts college for men and women, Wilkes today boasts of more than fifty buildings on a 23-acre campus, an athletic arena for a comprehensive sports program, and more than 2,500 young Americans and others from foreign lands learning to become educated citizens in a number of businesses and professions. • Its liberal arts program carries B.A. degrees in the Humanities, the Social Sciences, and the Natural Sciences; Bachelor of Science degrees in Chemistry, Physics, Medical Technology, Commerce and Finance, Art, Business, Music; Elementary, Secondary, and Nursing Education. • Four years' study in both Electrical, and Materials Engineering, Environmental Science, and Computer Science are being implemented as new programs. A Masters Degree may be earned in Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Business Administration and in Education. • Wilkes College assets surpass \$18,000,000. The College itself spends locally an average of six million dollars per year. • Such phenomenal growth in less than a half century has only been possible because of the faith and support of a few dedicated civic leaders who rallied to their cause a community who believed in itself at a time when its economic strength was slowly ebbing away. • Leading this vanguard, who believed the youth of the area were entitled to a higher education, is a man whose untiring efforts, sacrifices, and firm belief in both the College and the community. As President of Wilkes College since its inception, Dr. Eugene S. Farley inspired belief and conviction. His efforts and those of the Board of Trustees, Faculty and Administration have resulted in raising Wilkes to one of the 92 competitive colleges of the Nation. • Today, as in 1933, Wilkes College continues a partnership with a community that forges ahead on all fronts.
