by Philip Barry

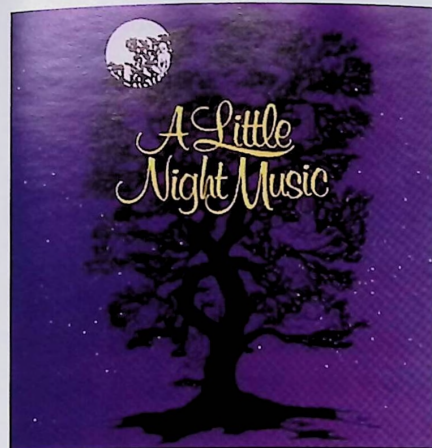

## "A Little Night Music"

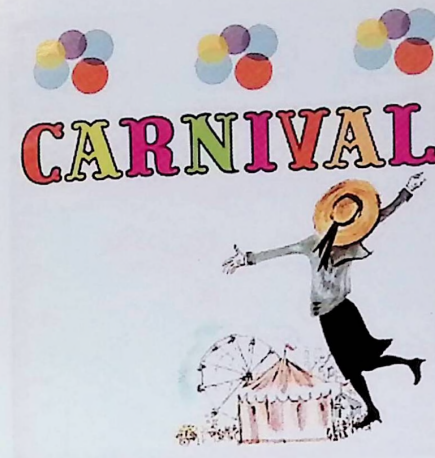
by Stephen Sondheim

## "Carnival"

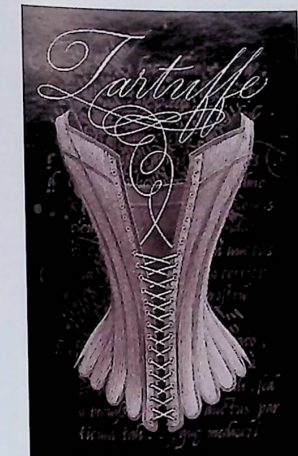

by Molière

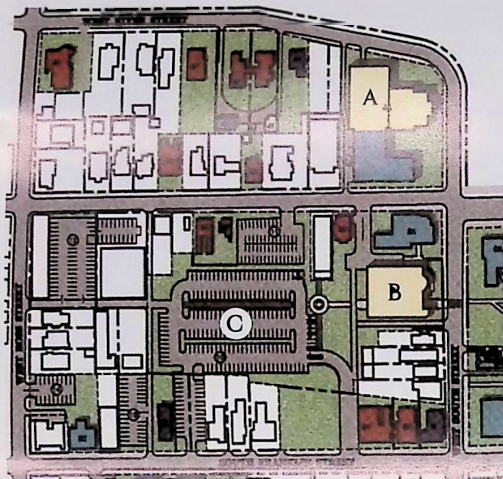
