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**CURRENT EVENTS.** Using newspapers and news magazines as sources, members of this group will discuss world events -- as they occur -- with Mr. Leroy E. Bugbee, head of social studies at Wyoming Seminary. Mr. Bugbee will provide background material with a view to throwing some light on the causes of present happenings.

Time: Wednesday evenings at eight, beginning October 3.

Mr. Bugbee will offer a similar course in the spring semester.

**THE CONTEMPORARY AMERICAN NOVEL.** Mr. Alfred Groh, instructor in English at Wilkes College, will provide opportunity for community members to consider with him the relationship between the contemporary American novel and the American scene. Members of the course will read and discuss Mark Twain, W. D. Howells, Stephen Crane, Willa Cather, Edith Wharton, Sinclair Lewis -- and such other novelists as they themselves propose.

Time: Tuesday evenings at eight, beginning October 2.

In the second semester, Mr. Joseph Donnelly, assistant professor of English at Wilkes College, will deal with the CONTEMPORARY BRITISH NOVEL in like manner. His group will read Gissing, Arnold Bennett, Maugham, Galsworthy, Forster, Huxley, Waugh, and Orwell -- among others.
